To the Clergy, Staffs and the Faithful parishioners of Brooklyn and Queens,

Recently, I met with our Vicar General, Regional Vicars, local Deans and priests during our annual Priest Convocation in Douglaston. During this gathering, we discussed important issues that we will need to address

in the near future, like new models of parish life, possible collaborations among parishes regarding Religious Education and other ministries, as well as assessing the current Mass schedules at all our parishes.

Allow me to share with you some statistics that were shared with the priests:

- In 2017, Mass attendance in our Diocese was reported at an average of 205,502 people per weekend. In 2022, the average was reported at 124,031. Due to demographic changes as well as the overall national trend of fewer Catholics attending Sunday Mass regularly, we see a decrease of nearly 40 percent in Mass attendance in our diocese in the last 5 years. This decline in Mass attendance means that we have in many parishes throughout the diocese large capacity churches with a significantly reduced Mass size.
- Due to a high number of priest retirements and deaths in recent years, there are fewer priests serving our 175 parishes.
- In our diocese Mass is celebrated in 14 different languages on a weekly basis and in 26 languages monthly. This unique pastoral challenge in combination with the reduced number of clergy with bi-lingual skills further complicates the ability to best serve our parishes with specific language needs.

In many of our parishes it is evident that we do not need so many separate Masses to accommodate the number of parishioners in attendance at Sunday Eucharist each week. We are asking pastors and administrators throughout the diocese in Brooklyn and Queens, in consultation with their pastoral councils, to review and evaluate their Mass schedules. In many parishes, the number of Masses celebrated each weekend could be reduced by at least one or maybe more Masses, depending on the number of people attending and the capacity of each church.

Additionally, your pastor in coordination with your Regional Vicar and local Dean, are beginning discussions at the deanery level concerning possible collaborations among neighboring parishes regarding Religious Education programs and other ministries, that could possibly lead to formal parish partnerships.

I ask for your openness and cooperation with these possible changes. Not every parish will be affected, but most will go through some sort of adjustment, in order to most effectively serve the current needs of the People of God in our great Diocese.

Be assured of my prayers for each of you, and may I humbly ask for your prayers, especially for our pastors and administrators, and all those who will be part of these discussions taking place throughout our parishes and deaneries.

EUCARISTIC REVIVAL 2022-2024 EXPLANATION OF THE MASS

After a series of short catechesis on the sacrament of the Eucharist, we will now have a series of short explanation of the different parts of the Mass.

Sign of the Cross: We make the *Sign of the Cross*, which is the Seal of Jesus, in reference to the Book of Revelation, which says that those who are marked on the foreheads with the seal of God shall be saved (Revelation 7:3). Also, the Sign of the Cross recalls the two commandments of Jesus, "Love God with all your heart . . . and your neighbor as yourself' (Matthew 22:37): the vertical bar of the cross signifies the love for God; the horizontal bar the love for our neighbor. We make the Sign of the Cross in this way: with the left hand on the chest, and the palm of the right hand turned toward ourselves, with all the fingers joined and held straight, we make the Sign of the Cross by moving our right hand from forehead to chest and from left shoulder to right.

Greeting: The opening *Greeting* of the Mass "The Lord be with you," is not a simple salutation, such as "Hello," or "Welcome," but it is a profession of faith in the presence of Christ in the assembly. It refers to Jesus' promise: "Where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them" (Matthew 18:20). The people's response, "And with your spirit," was the customary greetings among Christians since the time of the Apostles. St. Paul's greeting to the faithful was: "The Lord be with your spirit" (2 Timothy 4:22).

Penitential Act: The Penitential Act recalls the Parable of the Pharisee and the Tax Collector who went to the temple area to pray. The Pharisee, who was convinced of his righteousness and despised everyone else, took up his position and praised himself. But the tax collector stood off at a distance and would not even raise his eyes to heaven but beat his breast and prayed, "O God, be merciful to me a sinner," and he went home justified (Luke 18:9-14). Following the example of the tax collector, we strike our breast, acknowledging our sins of thoughts, words, actions, and omissions. The Penitential Act is a communal confession of sins with the corresponding absolution. The absolution, which was introduced by the Second Vatican Council in 1965, refers merely to venial sins, because the mortal sins can be absolved only through the Sacrament of Penance.

Eucharistic Revival (continuation)

Kyrie: The *Kyrie Eleison* (Greek for "Lord, Have Mercy"), is acclaimed in reference to people who called on God's mercy in the person of Jesus Christ. For example, as Jesus was leaving the city of Jericho, a blind man, Bartimaeus, was sitting by the roadside begging. When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout: "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me." Because of his faith, he was healed and became a disciple of Jesus (Mark 10:46-52). At the *Kyrie* we become like the blind man begging the Lord for healing, and entering into the gracious and healing mercy of God in Jesus Christ.

Saint's Corner:

St. Elizabeth of Hungary

November 17

Elizabeth was royal princess by birth. Born in 1207, she was the daughter of Andrew II, king of Hungary. She got married at age 14 to a Germanic prince Ludwig IV. Theirs was an extremely happy marriage, blessed with three children, a boy and two girls. Elizabeth was deeply in love with her husband and he with her. Both were saintly persons. Ludwig was modest, wise, patient, and trusted by his men and loved by his people. Elizabeth was beautiful, modest, kind in speech, fervent in prayer and most generous to the poor.

This last quality was to become her trademark. She led a simple and mortified life and gave most of her income to the poor. In this she tried to follow the ideals of Francis of Assisi, who was still alive then.

The castle of Wartburg where Elizabeth lived was built on a steep rock, which the sick and weak were not able to climb (the path leading to the castle was called the "knee-smasher"). In order to accommodate the sick and the poor, Elizabeth built a hospital at the foot of the rock. There she attended them, often fed them with her own hands, and made their beds. Helpless children, especially orphans, were provided for at her expense.

At that time the Germanic Emperor Frederick II, who was Ludwig's king, led the 6th crusade against the Muslims of the Holy Land. Ludwig joined the crusade, but he died during the crusade. Elizabeth and he had been married only six years. When she learned the news of the death of her husband, Elizabeth almost lost her mind from sheer grief.

After several months, Elizabeth made arrangements for the care of her children and in 1228, at the age of 20, she joined the Third Order of St. Francis. Then she lived with great austerity and entirely devoted herself to the care of the sick, the aged and the poor. Her health finally gave way and she died on this day in 1231 at the age of 23. She was canonized by Pope Gregory IX only four years after her death.


