Dear Ascension Family,

Blessings of peace and good health!

I presume that everybody read the letter of our bishop, Most Rev. Robert J. Brennan, the Bishop of Brooklyn, Parish partnership has been proposed. In QN6 Deanery, consisting of the parishes of Our Lady Queen of Martyrs, Resurrection-Ascension, Our Lady

of Hope, Our Lady of Mercy, St. Margaret, Ascension, St. Adalbert, Our Lady of the Angelus, and Sacred Heart, a partnering plan has been drawn up as follows: Our Lady Queen of Martyrs is partnered with Our Lady of Mercy; Our Lady of Hope with St. Margaret; Resurrection-Ascension with Our Lady of the Angelus; Ascension with St. Adalbert; Sacred Heart with St. Pancras in another deanery. This partnering of parishes is based on their proximity, consistent pastoral trends, and finances.

This parish partnership is a three-step process. The first step is that of partnering, whereby the two pastors work together instead of duplicating like programs. Possible changes to the Mass schedule and possible collaborations of pastoral programs are areas to work on starting in the first step. The second step is parish "twinning," that is, appointing one pastor to serve the two parishes which remain canonically and financially separate entities. The third step is the canonical merger of the twinned parishes, that is, uniting the two parishes into a single parish.

Openness is key to the success of this on-going process. It is a natural human tendency to want to stay with what is familiar and comfortable. However, for our own good and the good of the wider Church, we sometimes have to go beyond our comfort zone. Parish Partnership requires that we be open to doing things differently.

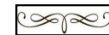

We are in the 3rd Sunday of Advent, which is traditionally known as *Gaudete Sunday*. The Latin word *Gaudete* means, "Rejoice." The rose-colored candle is lit on this Sunday, a liturgical symbol of joy.

But why should we rejoice? What gives us a cause for rejoicing? We need to ask that question especially in a world where there is so much misery, so much to be sad about, so much to mourn. In a world torn by so much violence, war, abject poverty and many forms of oppression, sometimes it is hard to find a reason for rejoicing. The gospel reading today gives us a clue why we should rejoice. The gospel reading speaks of John the Baptist telling his hearers that the Messiah is "one among you whom you do not recognize . . . whose sandal strap I am not worthy to untie." In other words, the Savior is among us, and so let us rejoice.

Francis of Assisi is called the joyful saint. This sense of joy was with him, despite the deprivations of voluntary poverty. His sense of joy came from the assurance that all would be well in God's providence. His joyful attitude went hand in hand with thanksgiving for all of God's gifts in creation. He was thankful for Brother Sun and Sister Moon. He was thankful for the flowers that bloomed and the birds that flew. He was even thankful for the approach of Sister Death.

As we celebrate this Sunday of joy, may we have the joys of St. Francis of Assisi. It is a joy based on faith, that God in his provident way will take care of his people. It is a joy based on hope, that in God's plan all will be well. It is a joy based on love, that true happiness consists in loving and being loved.

The message of *Gaudete Sunday* is that we find true happiness when we let God enter into our lives. When that happens then our priorities also shift. We will discover that true happiness does not depend on accumulation of wealth, honor, and praises. True happiness consists in being faithful to God. True happiness lies not on the consumption of things but on loving people.

With the coming of Christmas, the consumerist culture dictates to us that our joy is in buying and gathering things. It is time to remind ourselves where true joy lies. It is the continued presence of Christ in us and among us that gladdens our hearts, even in the midst of suffering. Joy is never within our power without the presence of Christ in us. Only Christ can fill us with the fullness of joy.

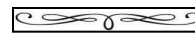

**EUCARISTIC REVIVAL 2022-2024
EXPLANATION OF THE MASS**

After a series of short catechesis on the sacrament of the Eucharist, we will now have a series of short explanation of the different parts of the Mass.

First Reading: After the Collect all sit. Then the lector (reader) goes to the ambo and reads from the Lectionary placed there before Mass. The Lectionary has rubrics which are not to be read aloud, for example: *First Sunday of Advent, Year B, First Reading, Isaiah 63:16-17, or the heading "Oh that you would tear the heavens apart and come down."* All that is proclaimed before the reading, in this example, is: *"A reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah."* Also, the lector should not hold up the lectionary when saying "The Word of the Lord." At the end of the reading there may be a period of silence for all to meditate on what has been heard.

Responsorial Psalm: The *Responsorial Psalm* used in the Mass is taken from the Book of Psalms or from a canticle of the Scriptures. It should be sung, especially on Sundays, because psalms are essentially prayers in the form of songs. It is called *responsorial* because the psalmist sings the verses, and the people reply with the response antiphon. The Responsorial Psalm is usually related to the First Reading, and has the purpose to involve the people in worship and praise. It is to be sung or recited at the ambo, and cannot be substituted by non-biblical song or texts.

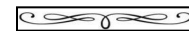

Second Reading: The *Second Reading* is always taken from the new Testament, and mostly from the Letters of St. Paul. It has a theme of its own, and it is read only on Sundays, Solemnities and Feasts.

Alleluia or Gospel Acclamation: The *Alleluia* is an acclamation of praise and glory for God, which is found in the Book of Tobit 13:18. It derives from the Hebrew words *Allelu* and *la*, meaning "All hail to Him Who is!" as equivalent to "Glory in the Highest." St. John the Evangelist said that the angels and saints in heaven sing the Alleluia to their God (Revelation 19:1). During Lent, the Alleluia is replaced by the Gospel Acclamation, in order to be solemnly sung again during the Easter Vigil. The people should stand for the singing of the Alleluia or the Gospel Acclamation.

Saint's Corner:

St. John of the Cross
December 14

St. John of the Cross was born in 1542 near Avila, Spain. His father died shortly after John's birth. And so John grew up in poverty. For a while he was apprenticed to a weaver, then became a servant at the hospital of Medina for seven years. The director of the hospital took a liking for John and arranged for him to study at the local Jesuit school. During his studies he already began to lead a life of prayer and mortification. In 1563, at the age of 21 he entered the Carmelite monastery of Medina. He studied theology at the University of Salamanca and was ordained in 1567.

John of the Cross is known as the partner of St. Teresa of Avila in seeking to establish an austere brand of the Carmelite Order that would observe the rigor of its primitive rule. These efforts at reform were met with opposition and personal attack. In one of the many episodes of hostility toward his effort, John was placed under house arrest by some fellow Carmelites who wanted to retain a more moderate rule. Eventually, John escaped and pursued the cause of reform. He lived in various places as superior of reformed convents. He also wrote during those years his great masterpieces about the spiritual life among them are *Ascent of Mt. Carmel*, *The Dark Night of the Soul*.

John died in 1591 at age 49. He was canonized in 1726 by Pope Benedict XIII and declared Doctor of the Church in 1926 by Pope Pius XI.

His life shows us that making reform entails sacrifice, work and hostility. People do not easily surrender their investment in the status quo.

John also teaches us that the dark night is a difficult but transforming grace. Some see the dark night as the loss of light and nothing more. John shows us that the dark night is the period before a great spiritual morning. The dark night can make us a saint.

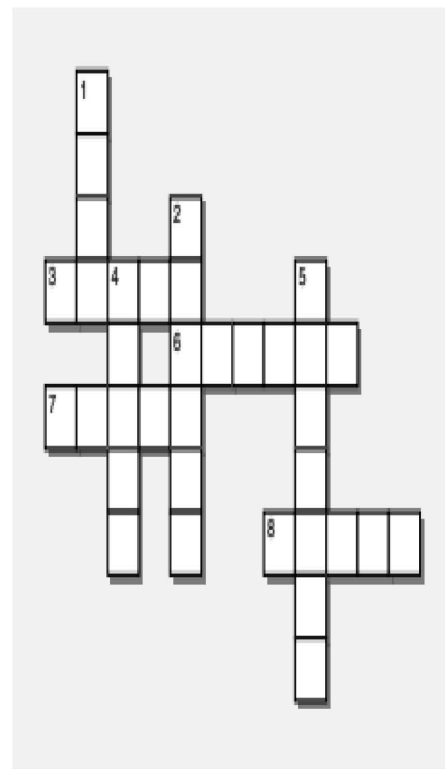

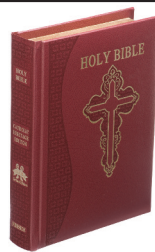
