From the Pastor's Desk:

Dear Ascension Family,

On behalf of the Ascension family, I and the entire parish staff would like to express our sincerest appreciation and gratitude to the many people - individuals and families, who shared their time, talent and treasures to make our celebration of Christmas, which started with the Simbang Gabi Masses, fruitful and meaningful. In a special way, we would like to thank the Parish Pastoral Council chaired by Romy Quiblat, the different parish ministries, the various parish choral groups, and the Religious Education Program led by Sr. Genevieve. Again, thank you very much for your unwavering support and care for our parish family.

A grace-filled New Year to all! The beginning of the year is usually the time we look at all the blessings God has given us during the past year, and we ask him to bless the new year. The Church dedicates the first day of the new year to the Virgin Mary, Mother of God. Being called "blessed" among women, let us look at the meaning of the word "blessing" in the Scripture. The Bible talks about blessing in four different ways: First, it talks about God blessing people. Thus God blesses Adam and Eve, saying, "Be fertile and multiply." The purpose of the blessing is to confer something special upon them: the power to reproduce themselves.

Second, the Bible talks about people blessing God. Thus St. Paul says to the Ephesians, "Blessed be the God who has blessed us." The purpose of the blessing is to thank and praise God for the undeserved blessings God gives us.

Third, the Bible talks about people blessing people. Thus Isaac blesses his son, Jacob. The purpose of the blessing is to ask God to confer on his son some-

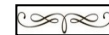

thing special. As we invoke God in blessing, we remember that God is in charge of the world. Even more, we remember that God loves us all.

Fourth, the Bible talks about people blessing things. Thus Jesus blesses bread. The purpose of the blessing is to make bread holy in a special way for the benefit of his followers.

In short, then, when God blesses us it is to give us something special. When we bless God, it is to thank and praise God for some undeserved gift.

This leads us to two practical conclusions: First, as we close out the old year, we should thank God for blessing us during the past year. This brings us to the second practical conclusion. Aside from counting our blessings from God during the year, we should consider sharing some of our blessings with others throughout the new year. This is how we bless God for having blessed us.

It is in this spirit that we should welcome the new year, with new opportunities to share God's blessings in order to serve our beloved parish family of Ascension. It is encouraging to remember that the first solemn feast we celebrate on the first day of the new year is the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God. It is very symbolic, for it means that the Blessed Mother ushers us into the beginning of the year, reassuring us that as a mother she will be with us through thick and thin. Mary as our mother is someone we can turn in time of need. She is someone who wants to help us. All we need to do is to turn to her. If we are looking for a New Year's resolution, we could do no better than to resolve to give the Blessed Mother a bigger role in our life.

Let us close with a prayer that St. Bernard used to pray daily to Mary:

Remember, O most loving Virgin Mary, that never was it known that anyone who fled to your protection, implored your help, or sought your intercession was left unaided. Inspired with this confidence, we turn to you, O Virgin of virgins our Mother. To you we come before you we stand, sinful and sorrowful. O Mother of the Word Incarnate, despise not our petitions, but in your mercy hear and answer us.

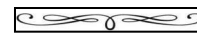

EUCARISTIC REVIVAL 2022-2024

EXPLANATION OF THE MASS

After a series of short catechesis on the sacrament of the Eucharist, we
will now have a series of short explanation of the
different parts of the Mass.

Rules for the Homily: The *Homily* is required on Sundays and holy
days of obligation at all Masses and cannot be omitted without a seri-
ous reason. It is recommended on other days, especially on the week-
days of Advent, Lent, and the Easter Season. The homilist must be an
ordained clergy (deacon, priest, or bishop), not only because they are
supposed to have a sufficient theological knowledge, but because they
have received the grace to speak *in persona Christi*. Even St. Francis
of Assisi, despite of his holiness, was required to be ordained as dea-
con in order to preach during the Mass. The purpose of the homily is
to explain the readings and make them relevant for the present day.
The priest gives the homily standing at the ambo or another suitable
place, or seating at the chair. After the homily, there may be a period
of silence. A well prepared homily should not last more than 10 min-
utes, as the famous Archbishop Fulton Sheen said: "If you want me to
speak for an hour, I am ready; if you want me to speak for 10 minutes,
I need a week of preparation." As the old saying goes: "Short homi-
lies move the hearts; long homilies move the chairs."

Creed: The *Creed*, or Profession of Faith, is the synthesis of our
Christian faith, and it is structured in three parts, in accordance with
the Three Persons of the Trinity. The word *Creed* comes from the
Latin *credo*, meaning "I believe." During the profession of faith all
make a profound vow at the words, "By the Holy Spirit was incarnate
of the Virgin Mary." There are two versions of the Creed - the **Nicene
Creed** and the **Apostles' Creed**. The *Nicene Creed* is the profession

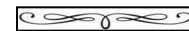

of faith compiled at the Council of Nicea in 325 AD, which was summoned by Emperor Constantine to define the Dogma of the Blessed Trinity (*God is one Divine Nature in three Divine Persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit*), and the two natures of Christ (*Christ is one divine person in two natures: human and divine*). It was confirmed by the Council of Constantinople in 381, and finalized at the Council of Chalcedon in 451. At first the Creed was to be proclaimed during Baptism, either in the form of questions and answer or in the narrative form, but starting the 6th century it became a part of the Sunday Mass. The *Apostles' Creed* is the baptismal symbol of the Roman Church. It was introduced in the Roman Missal of 1975 as an alternative to the Nicene Creed, to be used especially during Lent and Easter Time. It is named after the Apostles because it is rightly considered to be a faithful summary of the apostles' faith.

Saint's Corner:

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton
January 4

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton is one of the keystones of the American Catholic Church. She founded the first American religious community for women, the Sisters of Charity. She opened the first American parish school and established the first American Catholic orphanage. All this she did while raising her five children.

Elizabeth Ann Bailey was born in New York City in 1774, two years before the Declaration of Independence. Reared a staunch Episcopalian by her mother, she learned the value of prayer, Scripture and nightly examination of conscience. Her father, Dr. Richard Bayley, did not have much use for churches but was a great humanitarian, teaching his daughter to love and serve others.

The early death of her mother in 1777 and her baby sister in 1778 gave Elizabeth a feel for eternity and the temporariness of life on earth. Far from being brooding and sullen, she faced the difficult situations with hopeful cheerfulness. She married William Seton, a wealthy businessman, when she was nineteen. Together they had five children. Later, William's business went bankrupt and his health failed. They went to Italy hoping that the climate would bring improvement. Instead, William's illness worsened and he died.

Elizabeth had been drawn to Catholicism while in Italy and joined the Catholic Church when she returned to New York. Many of her family and friends rejected her when she became a Catholic in March 1805.

Elizabeth suffered great trials of sickness, misunderstanding, and the death of loved ones (her husband and two daughters). With God's grace, she wove all the difficulties in her life into a life of great service to the Church. Her life shows us how God can use the threads of our life, good and bad, to weave a great tapestry of faith and holiness. She died January 4, 1821, and became the first American-born citizen to be beatified (1963) and then canonized (1975).

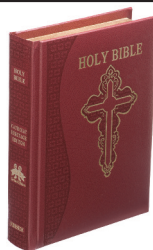
