From the Pastor's Desk:

Dear Ascension Family,

Blessings of peace and good health!

Today's gospel reading presents a very memorable encounter. In fact, John the Evangelist marked the hour: "It was about four in the afternoon." Jesus

was passing by and his cousin John the Baptist pointed him out to his two disciples, "Look! There is the Lamb of God!" The two disciples heard what he said and followed Jesus. When Jesus noticed the two following him, he asked them, "What are you looking for?" The two disciples were too excited to answer that question. Instead they asked, "Rabbi, where do you stay?" Jesus did not give them his address. Instead he invited them, "Come and see." And they stayed with him that day.

The added information, that it was four in the afternoon, is significant. The Jewish day begins not at midnight or dawn, but in the late afternoon. Some scripture scholars think that Andrew and his friend may have come to Jesus at four on a Friday afternoon. That was the beginning of the Sabbath, when all unnecessary movement and work were forbidden. In this case Andrew and his friend would have had to stay with Jesus not merely overnight, but the whole of the following Saturday as well.

We do not know what Andrew and his friend saw and heard during their stay with Jesus. But one thing is clear, that those twenty-four hours in Jesus' company changed their lives. For as soon as they left Jesus, Andrew hurried to find his brother Simon and gave him momentous, almost unbelievable news: "We have found the Messiah!" It is not difficult to imagine the excitement with which Andrew imparted his momentous message to his brother Simon. It could be compared continue next page

Yolanda De Castro Director of Stewardship to the excitement a person would feel at winning the jackpot of a lottery. Then Andrew brought his brother Simon to Jesus. And on seeing Simon, Jesus said, "You are Simon the son of John; you will be called Cephas (which is translated *Rock*).

Andrew became a disciple of Jesus because he responded positively to Jesus' invitation to "come and see." In carrying the unbelievable news of Jesus' identity to his brother Simon, Andrew moves from disciple to apostle. For "apostle" means "one who is sent", or messenger to others.

John the Baptist was instrumental in Andrew's discovery of Jesus as the Messiah and becoming one of Jesus' first apostles. Then, it was Andrew who was instrumental in Simon Peter's becoming not only an apostle but also the "Rock" upon which Jesus founded his Church.

When we reflect on the beginning of our Christian faith, many of us can point out to certain people, incidents or events that led us to Jesus. They can be our parents who taught us about him from our childhood and who as we grew up lived according to Jesus' teachings in thought, word and deed in their quiet way. They can be people who are bedridden or suffering from a chronic illness yet continue to put their trust in God as they fingered their rosary beads thus remaining cheerful, kind and considerate despite everything. Or it can be a good deed done to us by someone we do not even know or something we have heard or read or an event that happened to us which made us reflect on what life is all about thus leading us to start or even restart our journey of faith.

In short, before we got to know Jesus, there was a litany of people, incidents and events that came our way which enabled us to know and accept him in faith. In fact, this is the story of how Christianity spread throughout the world and how we accepted it in our own time. Having accepted Jesus, have we become the person we can be by living up to his teachings and examples? And have we become instrumental in bringing another person to meet and accept Jesus in faith?





EUCARISTIC REVIVAL 2022-2024 EXPLANATION OF THE MASS

After a series of short catechesis on the sacrament of the Eucharist, we will now have a series of short explanation of the different parts of the Mass.

Preparation of the Altar: An acolyte, or a minister, prepares the *altar*, placing the *corporal*, the *purificator*, the *chalice*, the *pall* and *Missal* upon it.

The altar, which is the center of the entire Lit-Altar: urgy of the Eucharist, is the sacred table where the sacrifice of Christ is sacramentally reenacted. The name comes from the Latin alere, meaning "to burn," since in many religions the incense and the sacrifices were burned on it. Also the Temple of Jerusalem had the Altar of Sacrifice, or Altar of Burnt Offerings, where thousands of lambs and other animals were burned in sacrifice. After Jesus offered himself on the cross as the perfect lamb of sacrifice, there was no longer need of the Altar of the Temple, which was destroyed in 70 AD by the Roman Army and never again rebuilt. The Altar, which is the focal point of the church, should be fixed and immovable, to represent the perpetual and unchanging sacrifice of Christ. can be easily circled and that the celebration can be carried on facing the people. The altar is to be covered with a cloth, which recalls the burial linen of Christ and the sacrificial nature of the Mass. The altar stays covered even outside the Mass, except on Holy Thursday and Good Friday. The practice of placing within the altar relics of the saints is to be maintained, because it signifies the communion of saints.

Corporal: The *corporal* is a square linen cloth, which is placed at the center of the altar, whose purpose is to catch any particles of the Host, or drops of the precious Blood, that might fall. It is named from the Latin word *corpus*, meaning "body," since it is placed under the paten and the chalice containing the Body and Blood of Christ. At the end of the mass, the corporal is carefully folded so that any particles will not fall to the ground or be scattered upon the altar cloth. The corporal rests on the altar only during Mass and is reverently removed after Holy Communion.

Saint's Corner:

St. Raymond of Peñafort

January 7

Raymond was born in 1175 in Spain. As a member of the Spanish nobility, he had the resources and the education to get a good start in life

He was teaching philosophy at the age of 20. In his early thirties he earned a doctorate in both canon and civil law. He became an eminent lawyer - but a lawyer with the heart of a saint. At age 41 he joined the Dominican Order. Pope Gregory IX called him to Rome to work for him and to be his confessor. One of the things the pope asked him to do was to gather together all the decrees of popes and councils. Raymond compiled five books called the *Decretals*.

At the age of 63, he was elected by his fellow Dominicans to be the master General of the Dominicans, remained in that post for two years and retired at 65.

At an age when most men may think about retiring to the golf course, Raymond began a life of preaching, instructing converts, and establishing religious houses. The second half of his life found him imitating the Lord by feeding thousands of people with the Word of life and the Bread of life.

Raymond was always forward-looking. His gaze was always the work he could still do for the Gospel. Sometimes we might feel that our best years are behind us, but every stage of life has its own strength and grace. As physical sight weakens in our senior years, insight grows. We are given the gift of time to use our accumulated experience to bring spiritual nourishment to others.

Although not formally declared as such, Raymond of Peñafort might well be the patron saint of senior citizens. He lived for a hundred years and used them all productively in the service of the Gospel.
