## From the Pastor's Desk

Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time February 4, 2024 Mark 1:29-39

Dear Ascension Family,

Blessings of peace and good health! I would like to reiterate my appreciation and gratitude to everyone of you for

your generous support to the 2023 Annual Catholic Appeal. We reached the amount of \$66,831.06, much beyond our goal of \$51,617.00. It really shows your loving concern and care for the people in need in various ways, whom the ACA is serving. My special thanks to Yolanda De Castro, the parish Director of Stewardship.

The gospel reading today describes a typical day in the ministry of Jesus. It tells us that "the whole town was gathered at the door" of Simon's house. They carried their sick and demon-inflicted loved ones. Christ cured them of their diseases and expelled the demons. But, "rising very early before dawn, he left and went off to a deserted place, where he prayed." Indeed Jesus was so busy preaching and healing that at times he did not have time to eat. And yet, he had time to pray. No matter how busy and exhausted he was, Jesus would always find time to pray and to be with his Father. He did not allow his Father to be crowded out of his life by activities. Pope John Paul II reminded religious "not to get so taken up by the work of the Lord that they would forget the Lord of the work."

Jesus was a man of prayer. Prayer was his secret weapon. Here lies the secret of his successful ministry. All his teachings and deeds were preceded by and proceeded from prayer. He spent 40 days praying in the desert before starting his public ministry. He spent a whole night in prayer before choosing the 12 apostles. Before every miracle he performed, he prayed to God. When the people wanted to make him king after the miracle of the loaves and fishes, he escaped to the mountain to pray. Before his passion and death, he spent long hours in agonizing prayer at the Garden of Gethsemane.

Some people say: "My action is my prayer." I am reminded of the activism days continue next page

in the 1970's in the Philippines. I was in the college seminary then. I know of a group of college university students who were activists protesting against the abuses and anomalies of government leaders. One of them said to me: "I don't go to Mass. I go to the masses." That was a popular slogan among the activists. Aside from the pun, there seems to be a grain of truth in it. If our Masses do not sharpen our concern for the needy, or if this concern does not lead to action, what good are our Masses? Our Masses should lead us to the masses. We must learn how to be with Jesus in his concern for the poor and the needy. On the other hand, however, action without prayer can easily become totally self-directed, self-propelled, rather than inspired by God.

A true Christian must be a person of action and a person of prayer. What we do must be according to God's will. And we cannot do this without prayer. I am reminded of my spiritual director when I was in Theology. He said to me that to live a spiritual life without prayer is like fish trying to swim without water.

The question is "How do we pray?" The answer is there are as many ways as there are people. God relates to each one of us as a unique person with our own background and temperament. Just as we relate to our close friends spending time together, sharing fun and tears, we can do the same with Jesus. Not so much with suitcases of novena booklets, but with words and sentiments straight from our heart.

God speaks to us in many ways. The trouble is we don't always listen or recognize his voice because of the distractions of this world, like concern for wealth, power, popularity, or certain questionable relationships. God's voice is drowned out amidst all these distractions and attractions.

That is why the "sacred time" with the Lord is so important. It does not have to be a five-day retreat (although that would be most helpful). But everyone can spare 15 to 30 minutes each day to pray. Or, one can do the "consciousness examen" at the end of the day. First, thank God for all the blessings for the day. Then try to look back to see how God has been present to you today, and how have you responded to him. Next, be sorry for your lack of response, and thank him for the successes and growth in your spiritual life. Then look forward to the next day to see how he is likely to encounter you. End with a closing prayer in your own words or the "Our Father."





### **EUCARISTIC REVIVAL 2022-2024** EXPLANATION OF THE MASS

After a series of short catechesis on the sacrament of the Eucharist, we will now have a series of short explanation of the different parts of the Mass.

**Prayer over the Offerings:** The *Prayer over the Offerings* is done to ask God to accept and bless our humble gifts, and to deem it worthy to use the bread and wine as the matter for the Consecration.

The Eucharistic Prayer: The Eucharistic Prayer, also called anaphora, is the part of the Mass where the sacrifice of Christ is sacramentally reenacted. It include the Preface, Holy, Consecration, Memorial Acclamation, Doxology and Great Amen.

**Preface:** The *Preface* is a hymn of gratitude to the Father for all the blessings he has given us, especially the incarnation of Christ. The text of the Preface changes according to the season or the celebration of the day, but it always ends in this or similar manner; "And so with angels and archangels and the whole company of heaven we sing the unending hymn of your praise."

Holy: The Sanctus, or Holy, is a hymn of praise which resembles the one sung by the saints and angels in Paradise. The first part is taken from the angelic hymn of Isaiah: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory" (Isaiah 6:3); the second part recalls the joyful shouts of the people when Jesus entered Jerusalem: "Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord" (Mark 11:9).

## Eucharistic Revival (continuation)

Consecration: Consecration, from the Latin *cum* and *sacrare* meaning "to make sacred," is the part of the Mass when the Bread and Wine become the Body and Blood of Christ. This happens when the priest proclaims the words that Jesus uttered during the Last Supper: "This is my body . . . this is my Blood" (Matthew 26:26-28). The words of the Consecration are called the form of the Mass, and if the priest makes any alteration or omission, the whole Mass becomes invalid.

#### Saint's Corner:

## **St. Blaise** February 3

Blaise was a bishop in the city of Sebastea, Armenia around the year 300. A persecution broke out and he was forced to flee to the hills. There he lived as a hermit in solitude and prayer, but made friends with the wild animals. It is said that he had an extraordinary power over wild animals.

One day a group of hunters seeking wild animals for the amphitheaters stumbled upon the cave where Blaise was living. They saw the bishop kneeling in prayer surrounded by wild animals - wolves, lions and bears. The hunters reported him to the authorities. He was arrested and on his way to prison, a mother came with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. Blaise blessed the boy and his throat was cleared. This incident explains why the feast of St. Blaise is marked each year by a simple and popular sacramental - the blessing of throats.

While Blaise was in prison, Agricolaus, the governor of Cappadocia, tried to persuade him to sacrifice to pagan idols to save himself. The first time Blaise refused, he was beaten. The next time he was suspended from a tree and his flesh torn with iron combs or rakes. Finally he was beheaded.

St. Blaise has been invoked for protection against all ailments of the throat. On the feast of St. Blaise, let us ask his intercession not only for protection against physical throat ailments, but also the grace to use the gift of speech to speak the truth and not lies, to give encouragement and not criticism, to build people up and not tear them down.

The gift of speech is a very powerful weapon. Words can make war or bring peace. The physical hurts we inflict on people will heal, but the wounds we inflict by what we say can last a lifetime. May we use the gift of speech in the service of God's kingdom.


