### *From the Pastor's Desk*

Third Sunday of Lent  
March 3, 2024  
John 2:13-25

Dear Ascension Family,

Greetings of peace and good health! We are familiar with the word "cool." But generally, a person who is cool maintains a quiet dignity and serenity even with things falling apart around him.

We try to be cool most of the time. There are times though when we lose our cool. Then, the unexpected behavior comes up. We raise our voice, we kick the furniture, or throw things out of the window. What makes us lose our cool? Usually we lose our cool when we are personally hurt, when somebody we love is being hurt, or something we care deeply about is not respected.

In the gospel reading today, Jesus did something seemingly out of character. He who was gentle and patient with his disciples and sinners, and who preached about love and forgiveness, got very angry. He was upset seeing the disrespect going on in the house of God, which was supposed to be a house of prayer.

During the Feast of Passover, the Jews went on pilgrimage to the Temple to offer sacrifice. The law prescribed that the animals to be sacrificed at the temple must be "unblemished." Therefore the temple authorities had to inspect the animals to make sure that they were fit for sacrifice. If people bought the animal from the temple, they easily passed the inspection, although the price of the animal may have been as much as 20 times higher than those being sold elsewhere. Moreover, since many of them came from different parts of the world, their money bore the image of the emperor (this was forbidden by the first commandment). So people were

forced to change their money into temple money (the only money acceptable in the temple offering) but at an exorbitant exchange rate, which went into the pockets of the merchants and money-changers, who, in effect, had made the temple - holiest place of worship of God's people - into a marketplace. And the temple authorities were behind these money-making ventures!

However, if we examine ourselves honestly, we might see that we are no different from the merchants, money-changers and the religious authorities of Jesus' time. By virtue of our Baptism, we are meant to be a dwelling place of the Blessed Trinity. St. Paul, in his letter to the Corinthians, declares, "God's temple is holy, and you are that temple"(1Cor 3:17). Do we try to make ourselves pleasing to God? Have we appreciated the blessings and gifts that God has given us? Or have we misused them for our selfish gratification, and have been offending God?

When Jesus spoke of the temple being destroyed and "raised up" in three days, he was not referring to the temple made of stone which had taken forty years to build. Rather he was referring to the temple of his body. With Jesus, the Jewish temple has become a thing of the past. He is now the living Temple through whom all those who believe have access to God. He is now the only worthy sacrifice we can offer to the Father.

In other words, we don't have to go to the temple of Jerusalem for worship. God has made it so easy for us to worship him in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. But like anything that is familiar and easily accessible we take for granted. Many people come to Mass because it is an obligation, not for love of God. That is why they do not put their heart and mind into what is going on in the Mass. No wonder there are people during Mass gossiping, or people with cellphones in their hands texting, or hanging from their ears talking.

I am reminded of a priest who asked some parishioners: "Have you been going to Mass regularly?" "Yes, Father," they replied. "But how come I have not seen you in our church?" he asked them. They answered, "You see, Father we have been going to Mass at the shopping mall, not in our church." The priest exasperatedly remarked: "What is happening these days? People go to shopping centers to attend Mass, while many go to churches like they are going for shopping!" In shopping when we see something we like, we pay for it and we get it. If we don't see anything that pleases us, we leave the place and shop somewhere else.

The picture of Jesus cleansing the temple of Jerusalem is a reminder for us of what we should be doing to sin in our life. Lent calls us to do just that.

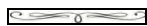

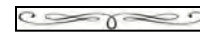

**EUCARISTIC REVIVAL 2022-2024  
EXPLANATION OF THE MASS**

*After a series of short catechesis on the sacrament of the Eucharist, we will now have a series of short explanation of the different parts of the Mass.*

**Proper Reception of Holy Communion:** As a rule, the communicants approach in procession. The faithful are not permitted to take up the Consecrated Bread or the Sacred Chalice themselves, and still less to hand them onto one another. The faithful receive Holy Communion as they choose: either *standing* or *kneeling*, either on the *tongue* or in the *hand*. The Sacred Host is consumed in its entirety as soon as it is received. The choice on the manner of receiving Holy Communion is on the communicant, and not on the priest or minister of Holy Communion. Traditionalists would say that Communion must be received only kneeling and on the tongue, so that no particle will be lost; on the other hand, Modernists claim that Communion should be received only on the hand, as Jesus did during the Last Supper. The Church allows either manner, as long as Holy Communion is received with due respect and holiness.

**Communion Under Both Kinds:** There are two manners of receiving Communion under both kinds: 1) The communicant first receives the Body of Christ; and then the priest hands the chalice to the communicant, who drinks from it, hands it back

to the priest and withdraws. The priest wipes the rim of the chalice with the purificator. 2) By *intinction*: an acolyte holds the communion plate under the chin of the communicant; the priest instincts the hosts into the chalice and, showing it, says: "The body and blood of Christ." The communicant responds: "Amen," and receives the Sacrament in the mouth.

**Communion Ministers:** In the distribution of Holy Communion, if other priests are not available and there is a great number of communicants, the priest may be assisted by the *Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion*, or in their absence by acolytes or members of the faithful commissioned by the priest only for that occasion.

**Saint's Corner:**

**St. Casimir**  
March 4

Born in a palace in Cracow in 1458, Casimir was the second son of Casimir IV, King of Poland. As a boy Casimir was very devoted to prayer, the Blessed Sacrament, and the Blessed Virgin Mary. He would kneel in prayer at night before locked church doors. While still in his teens, he resolved to remain single and serve God in lifelong celibacy. He practiced many mortifications in secret, wore a hair shirt under his clothes, often slept on the ground. He was particularly concerned about helping the poor. As a young prince at court, he was always cheerful and pleasant.

When he was about 13 years old, a dispute arose between the king of Hungary, King Matthias Corvinus, and his nobles. These nobles asked King Casimir of Poland to send his young son Casimir to dethrone Corvinus and become their king. Young Casimir was extremely reluctant to consent to this plan because he figured that dethroning Corvinus was an unjust move. However, he felt compelled to obey his father and, out of sheer obedience to him, marched at the head of 20,000 men to the Hungarian frontier. But his army was clearly outnumbered by that of Corvinus, and some of his troops were deserting in large numbers because they were not paid. On the advice of his officers, Casimir decided to return home, resolved not to enter into a suicidal and unjust war.

Unfortunately, his father was so mortified at the failure of his plan that he imprisoned young Casimir for three months in a remote castle. On that occasion the lad made up his mind never again to become involved in the wars of his time, and no amount of pressure exerted on him was ever able to make him change his mind. From then on he concentrated his attention on prayer and study.

He died of a lingering illness at the age of 25 on this date in 1484. He was canonized in 1521 by Pope Leo X, and was declared patron of Poland and Lithuania.

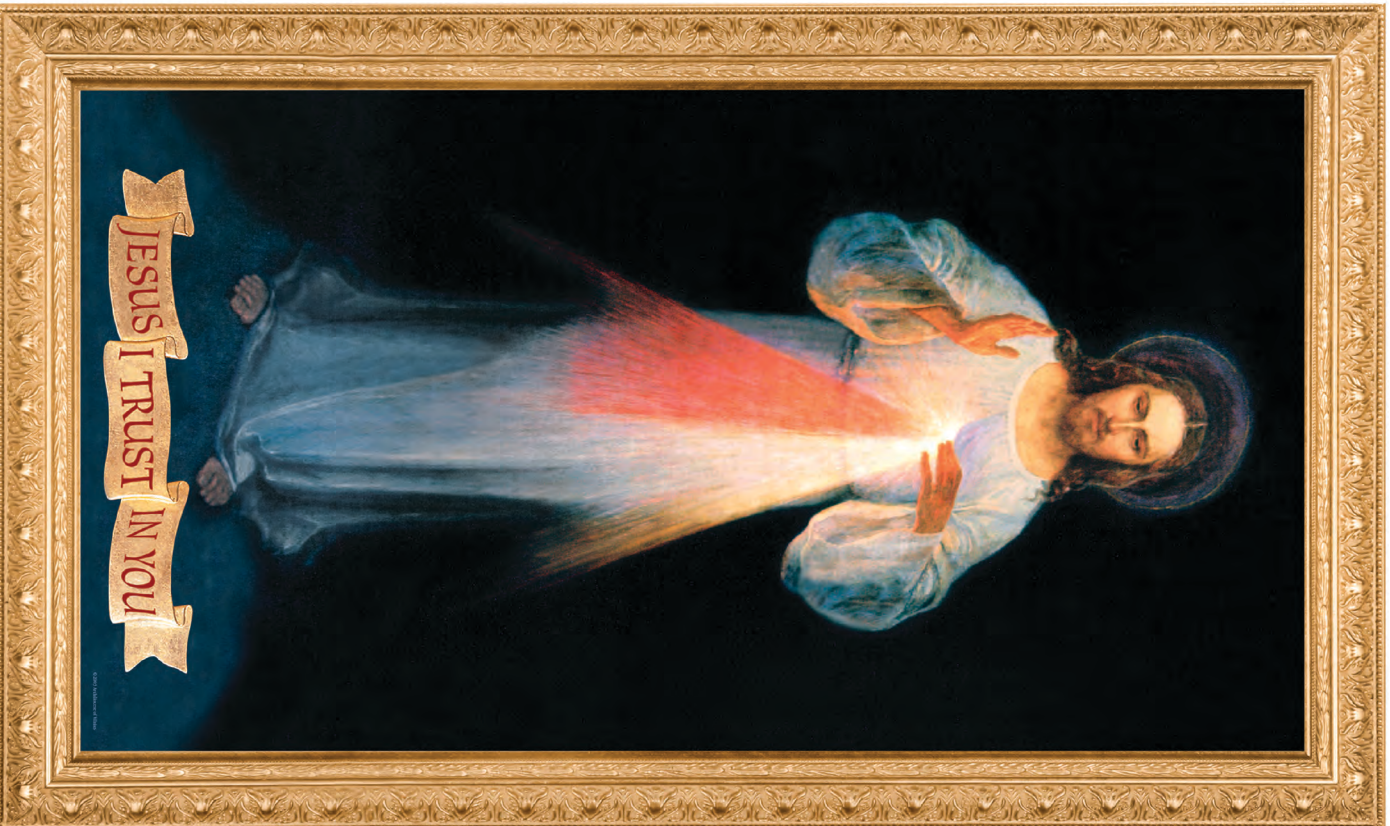

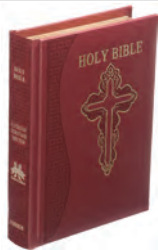
