## FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT MARCH 10, 2024



### *From the Pastor's Desk*

Fourth Sunday of Lent  
March 10, 2024  
John 3:14-21

Dear Ascension Family,

Greetings of peace and good health! The first part of today's gospel reading refers to the bronze serpent. In the account of Exodus, when the Israelites were being led by Moses from Egypt, the land where they had been slaves towards the Promised Land in Palestine, they lost faith in the leadership of Moses. They criticized both Moses and God.

In order to discipline them, God allowed an invasion of poisonous snakes, and many of them died from the bite of those snakes. The people then repented of their rebellion and asked Moses to intercede for them with God, which Moses did. God immediately responded with forgiveness, and told Moses to make a bronze serpent and set it on a pole, so that the people could easily see it. And so, from then on all those who were bitten by a snake and looked with faith at the bronze snake were saved (*see* Numbers 21:4-9). The serpent that kills became the serpent that heals. (Probably, it is from this event, that the medical profession has chosen the image of the snake coiled around a pole as the symbol for its healing profession.)

Jesus parallels this Exodus event to his crucifixion on Calvary. "Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that all who believe may have eternal life in him." The cross that kills becomes the cross that saves. The cross that was the symbol of death became the symbol of life.

The cross is a concrete picture of how much God loves us. "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him may not die, but may have eternal life." It was the most God had to give. The bronze serpent was

perched upon a pole for people to turn their thought to God and be healed of the snake's poisonous bites. Christ was crucified on the cross for mankind to experience the saving love of God. The bronze serpent was a result of mercy from a punishing God; Christ crucified is the real truth of a God who is loving and who offered in sacrifice his own Son to save the world.

But since we are free, we can refuse to accept God's love shown in Jesus Christ. It is then that we bring judgment to ourselves. The gospel reading today says, "And this is the verdict, that the light came into the world, but people preferred darkness to light." St. Augustine expressed this truth differently: "God who created us without our cooperation will not save us without our cooperation."

The concept of a loving God was hard to understand for the Jewish people, especially for its leaders. God for them is the God of law, and they who have meticulously followed the smallest details of the law are the special ones. God is angry and unforgiving with sinners. And the Pharisees and scribes capitalized on this promise to advance their relevance as the legal and spiritual authorities. That God sent his own Son to become human and to be crucified on the cross was absolutely ridiculous for the Jews who were expecting a powerful Messiah to liberate them from their colonizers.

God could have saved us some other way but God chose the sacrifice of his Son on the cross. The cross is the way to salvation; it is the way to the resurrection.

I am reminded of a story. A person who was praying asked the Lord: "Lord, I would like to reach the haven of eternity. What ship would I take?"

The Lord replied: "The Cross!"

He asked again: "Lord, I would like to climb up to heaven. What stairs should I use?"

The Lord replied: "The Cross!"

He asked for the third time: "I would like to enter into paradise. What key would open it?"

The Lord replied: "The Cross!"

That is why the cross is at the center of every Catholic Church in the world. That is why the cross is also at the center of the Church's preaching.

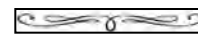

**EUCARISTIC REVIVAL 2022-2024**

**EXPLANATION OF THE MASS**

*After a series of short catechesis on the sacrament of the Eucharist, we will now have a series of short explanation of the different parts of the Mass.*

**Prayer After Communion:** The *Prayer After Communion*, which concludes the Communion Rite, is said by the priest alone, standing at the altar or the chair. This is the last of the three *presidential prayers*, and cannot be replaced by any other prayer. The purpose of this Prayer is to give thanks to God for the gift of the Eucharist, and to encourage the faithful to practice it in their lives.

**The Concluding Rites:** The concluding rites consist of: a) brief announcements, b) the priest's blessing, c) dismissal.

**Brief Announcements:** When the *Prayer After Communion* is concluded, if needed, brief announcements to the people may be made by the priest or by a lector. Long and tedious announcements, as well as commercial promotions of any kind, should never be allowed in the celebration of the Holy Mass.

**Blessing:** The priest, joining his hands and then immediately placing his left hand upon his breast, elevates his right hand and says: "*May almighty God bless you* - and, as he blesses with the Sign of the Cross, continues - *the Father, and the Son and the Holy Spirit.*" All make the sign of the Cross and answer: "*Amen.*"

**Dismissal:** In the Latin Missal, the people are dismissed with the words: "*Ite, missa est,*" which are translated "Go forth, the Mass is ended." These words, which have given the most common for the Eucharist - the Mass, reflect the missionary mandate given by Jesus to *(Continuation on page of Saint's Corner)*

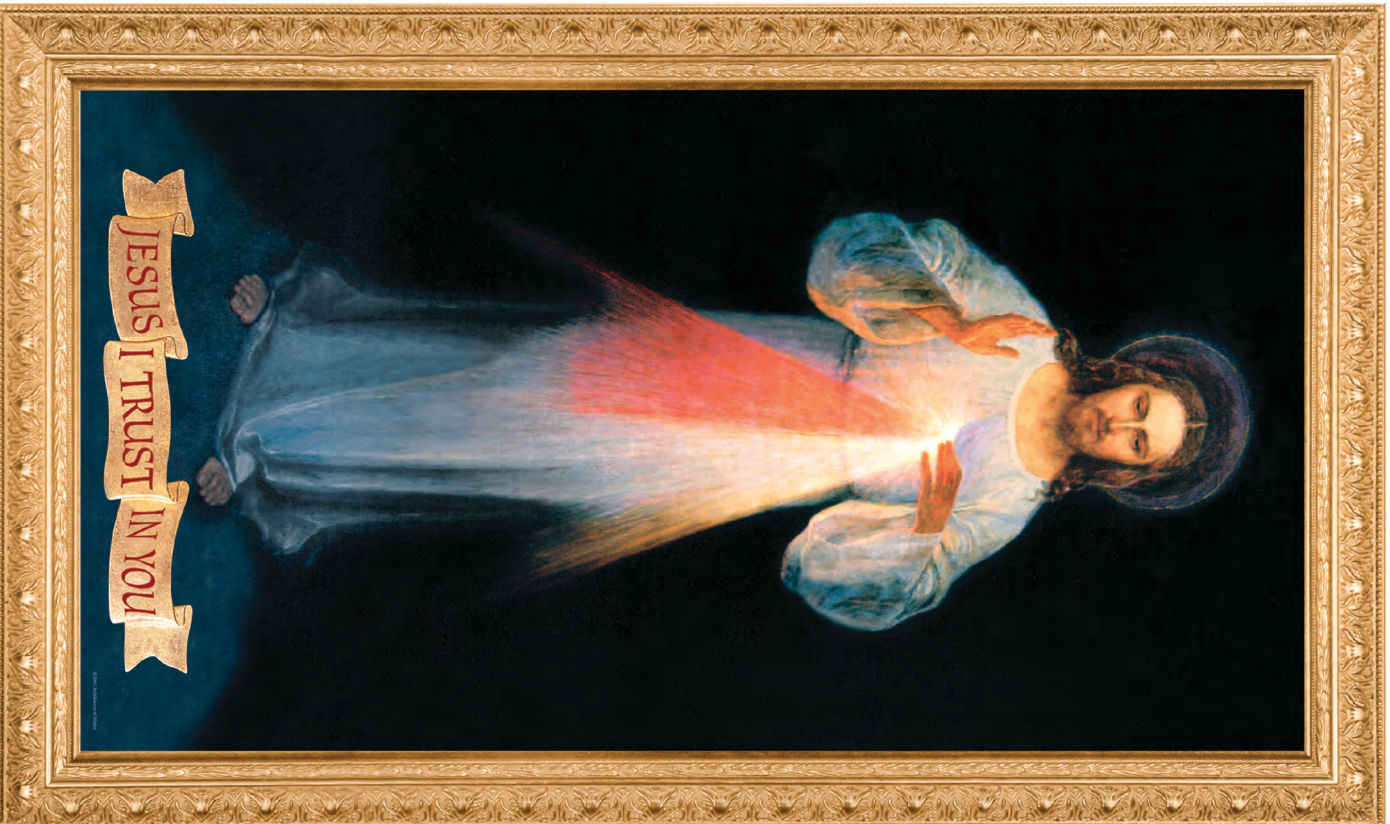

his disciples before ascending into heaven: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit"(Matthew 28:19). When we enter the Eucharist we are *disciples*, when we exit we are apostles (sent).

**Procession:** After kissing the altar, the priest, together with the ministers, return in procession to the sacristy in the same way and in the same order in which they entered, under the accompaniment of a Recessional Chant. At the sacristy all make a reverence to the cross.

**Saint's Corner:**

**St. Frances of Rome**  
March 9

Frances was born in Rome in 1384 to a noble and wealthy family. Already at the age of 11 she asked her parents to allow her to become a nun. But her parents, though excellent Christians, had other plans for her. When she reached the age of 13, they married her to Lorenzo dei Ponziani, a rich landowner, to whom she bore three children (two sons and a daughter). Their marriage was a good one. In all the forty years that she lived with her husband there was never the slightest dispute nor misunderstanding between them. One of the reasons for this harmony was that Frances gave top priority to her duties as a wife and mother, interrupting her prayers whenever her husband or children needed her. As for her children, even though she could afford paid helpers, she allowed no one but herself to look after them during their childhood.

Fortunately for Frances, early on in her marriage she discovered that one of her sisters-in-law, Vannoza, had also dreamed of becoming a nun and still yearned for a deeper life of prayer and self-dedication to the needy. So the two young women developed a lifelong friendship and henceforth gave themselves as a rule of life that would help them become better Christians. Plainly dressed, together they began to visit the poor of Rome, ministering to their wants and relieving their distress. Their husbands, who were both devoted to them, did not object to the charities and austerities. Daily the two young women went to nurse the patients of a nearby hospital, taking a special care of those suffering from the most repulsive diseases. However, these charitable works they performed only after doing their housework and discharging all their domestic duties.

Over the years Frances' life was not always a bed of roses. At one point in time a great plague swept across Italy, cruelly devastating Rome. Frances lost a son and a daughter to that plague. Yet, that did not prevent her from doing everything she could to help the sick and buy them whatever they needed. She also converted a section of her house into a hospital.

In 1425 Frances formed a society of women living in the world and bound by no vows, but pledged to make a simple offering of themselves to God and to the service of the poor. She died in 1440, and was canonized in 1608 by Pope Paul V.

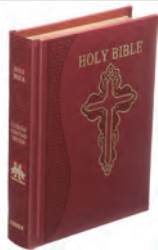
