# From the Pastor's Desk

Sixth Sunday of Easter May 5, 2024 John 15:9-17

Dear Ascension Family,

Blessings of peace and good health! I hope everything is going well with all of you. On May 12 at 4:00 PM we have a special Mass to celebrate the feast of our parish - Ascension of the Lord. The main celebrant of the Mass is Most Reverend Raymond F. Chappetto, Auxiliary Bishop Emeritus of the Diocese of Brooklyn. Within the Mass Bishop Chappetto will bless a new tabernacle replacing what we have now which is no longer safe. He will also give a special blessing on Mothers to celebrate Mothers' Day. The celebration is preceded by a nine-day novena from May 3 to May 11 with novena prayer at 6:30PM and Holy Mass at 7:00PM. Bring your family and friends to the celebration. This is a great opportunity for us as a community to be with one another and revitalize our involvement in the parish life. Let us pray together, deepen our faith together, and celebrate together the gift of faith.

We are in the 6th Sunday of Easter. The gospel reading reminds us of our call to a life of mission serving one another in love in imitation of Jesus.

When a child hurts himself at home, to whom does he run crying? More often than not, to his mother. And what does the mother do? She lovingly blows into and kisses the painful part and tells the child that the pain is gone. And, like magic, the child feels relieved thereafter. A mother's love is even more evident when her child gets sick. She attends to all his needs - day and night. She only sleeps when she feels that the child is already sleeping. Fernando Velazquez Maria San Pedro one of the closest approximation of God's love for us is that of a mother for her child.

In the gospel reading today, Jesus tells his disciples that his love for them is the same as his Father's love for him. "As the Father loves me, so I also love you." Jesus passes on to his disciples the love which he has received from the Father. The words Jesus spoke to the disciples then, are spoken to us today. We are loved by God, no less.

After telling us that he loves us as he has been loved by the Father, Jesus practically pleads with us to remain in his love: "Remain in my love." He says this after making the flat statement: "I love you." Thus he does not ask us to reciprocate his love for us by loving him in turn. He simply asks us to let his love envelope us and to abide in it.

Jesus gives us a sign that will tell us whether we are abiding in his love. It is our obedience to his commandment. That commandment does not relate to him directly at all; it relates to our fellow men. We are to love others in turn, even as he has loved us. Rather than having his love returned to him, he wants it to be shared with others. Like the waters of a river, it is to flow outward and spread to others rather than return to its source. As Jesus puts it: "There is no greater love than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends." Love gives of itself; it does not look for a return.

The Lord wants us not only to remain in God's love. He wants us to pass on God's love to one another. "Love one another as I have loved you." We have been loved with an undeserved love. We should love others even though they do not deserve our love. We have been loved with a love faithful to the end. We must also love one another with a love faithful until death. We have been loved with a self-sacrificing love. We ought also to love others with a love willing to sacrifice even our own lives.

Although this love does not seek any return, it is a joyous love nevertheless. It is not the joy of satisfaction which a person feels when he is aware that he is performing an important job well. It is not the joy of success that flows from serious and even generous-hearted effort. It does not come from the self.

The joy that Jesus promises to those who abide in his love is of a wholly different character. The context of Jesus' words in the gospel reading today gives us some insight into this character. Jesus has just washed the feet of his apostles and instituted the Eucharist. In a few minutes he will head out to the garden of Gethsemane where he will be arrested. Yet it is at this moment that Jesus speaks of his joy, the joy that he wishes to share with his apostles. It is the joy of total abandonment to the love of his Father. It is a joy that comes from the realization that there is nothing lacking in the security of the Father's loving embrace.

When Jesus talks about "love," he is not just talking about warm fuzzy feelings, which come and go, but he is talking about love which transcends the emotions that attract us to each other. Love is a decision, and you can make that decision regardless of the temperature of your heart. It is not a matter of emotions. It is a free decision of the will.



Saint's Corner:

### St. Philip Neri May 26

Philip Neri, the saint of a joyful heart, was born in 1515 in Florence, Italy. At age 17, his family sent him to his uncle, Romolo, a merchant of San Germano, who was willing to take Philip into his business and eventually make him his heir. But during his stay with his uncle, Philip experienced some kind of spiritual awakening, an experience of God which in later years he spoke of as his "conversion," and after which he lost all interest in a commercial career. This experience was the initial spark which triggered his ensuing quest for holiness.

Philip left for Rome at 18 years old and worked as a part-time tutor to earn a living. For the next two years he spent most of his non-tutoring hours in prayer and fasting. After that, for the following three years he took courses of philosophy and theology and proved a brilliant student. However, in 1538 he dropped out of his studies and, for the next 13 years, devoted himself in a vocation unusual at the time - that of a layperson actively engaged in prayer and apostolate.

Rome was then in a sorry condition, both economically and spiritually. Philip dedicated his energies to helping the poor and the sick for one part, and for the other part to reevangelizing the paganized Rome. His main method of evangelization was **conversation**. He would stand on street-corners and smilingly greet passersby with the words: "Well, brother, when shall we begin to do good." Then he would engage them in conversation about the faith. After 13 yeas of this life, upon the insistence of his confessor he was ordained a priest at the age of 36.

Philip Neri wanted to become a missionary but he was persuaded that the city of Rome was very needful of missionary work. Many people came to him for spiritual direction and confession. Through his engaging personality marked by charm, humor and intelligence, he rapidly gathered around himself followers. Initially they met as an informal prayer and discussion group, and also served the sick and the poor in Rome. When several of his followers became priests, he encouraged them to live as a community. This was the beginning of a new religious family, later called the Congregation of the Oratory.

Philip's advice was sought by many of the prominent figures of his day. He is one of the influential figures of the Counter-Reformation. His characteristic virtues were humility and cheerfulness. Philip Neri prayed, "Let me get through today, and I shall not fear tomorrow." He died at the age of 80. Barely 27 years later he was canonized by Gregory XV in 1622.


