Fernando Velazquez Maria San Pedro But instead, it did just the opposite. Christianity began to spread like wild fire. How did it happen?

The amazing story is told in the book of the Acts of the Apostles. And the starting point of that amazing story is when the Holy Spirit, whom Jesus had promised to send his disciples, transformed them. The confused and fearful disciples were transformed into a courageous body of believers, which St. Paul calls the Body of Christ, which we call the Church. Thus Pentecost is rightly called the birthday of the Church. It is the birthday of God's new family.

To illustrate what this new family means, let me share with you a story. Some years ago an artist was commissioned to do a painting illustrating the point that, through the Church, God calls all nations to be one family. The artist decided to model his painting after the lines of an old hymn that read, "Around the throne of God in heaven thousands of children stand."

Late one night, after weeks of work, the artist finished the painting. Shortly after falling asleep, he seemed to hear a noise in his painting room. When he went to investigate, he found a stranger changing his painting. The stranger was changing the color of the faces of the children. One was now red, another brown, another black, and another yellow.

"What are you doing?" shouted the artist. "I am correcting your painting," said the stranger. "You have painted only white faces answering my call." "Your call?" said the artist. "Yes," said the stranger. "I said to my disciples, 'Let the children come to me; do not prevent them for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these.' That is what I told my disciples in Gospel times, and that is what I am still telling them."

Then the artist awoke, and realized that he had been dreaming. The next morning he revised his painting in line with his dream. The Church is the vehicle through which God is saying to us, "Let the children of all nations come to me and become one family."

At Pentecost God reversed the disaster of Babel which divided and confused the unity of the human family. The Holy Spirit makes known to all peoples the one true God, and so creates from the many languages of people one voice to profess one faith. But the Church is more than just a body of believers sharing the same faith. It is the Body of Christ sharing a common life.

In the gospel reading today, Jesus prefaces his bestowal of the Holy Spirit with the words, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." The Holy Spirit is given to empower the disciples to carry out Jesus' mandate to preach the gospel to all nations. Like the disciples of Jesus in today's gospel reading, each of us received the Holy Spirit through Baptism and Confirmation. And like the disciples, we are sent on a mission.

There is so much spiritual power for good in each of us. Shall we let this power go unused? Or, shall we use it to do good to others and help renew the face of the earth?



Saint's Corner:

### St. Isidore the Farmer May 15

Isidore was born in Madrid, Spain, in 1070. As soon as he was old enough to work, Isidore entered the service as a farm laborer of a wealthy landowner from Madrid, and worked faithfully on his estate outside the city for the rest of his life. He married a young woman as simple and upright as himself who also became a saint - Maria de la Cabeza. They had a son, who died as a child. He tilled the fields from dawn to dusk.

Isidore was a man devoted to prayer. He rose early in the morning to go to Mass before going to work each day. All day long, as he tilled the fields, he communed with God. It is said that he was seen to have angels helping him in plowing the fields. He was known for his love of the poor. He would share with the poor his own share of the fruits of his labor.

Isidore died on May 15, 1130 at the age of 60. It may have been providential that St. Isidore was declared a saint in 1622 with Ignatius of Loyola, the great founder of the Jesuits, Francis Xavier, the great Jesuit missionary, Teresa of Avila, the great Carmelite reformer, and Philip Neri, the great apostle of Rome. By his very presence in their company, we can see the multiple roads to holiness. Some of these roads are dramatic and others are arduous. For other people, it is a simple path along which we walk with Christ to the Father. This was the case of Isidore the Farmer. He was an ordinary man doing an ordinary work but filled with the extraordinary grace of the Holy Spirit. That is what made him a saint to whom we can all relate.

There are lessons to be learned in a farmer becoming a saint: physical labor has dignity; sainthood does not stem from status; ordinary life is conducive to holiness.
