From the Pastor's Desk

16th Sunday in Ordinary Time July 21, 2024 Mark 6:30-34

Dear Ascension Family,

Blessings of peace and good health!

"What goes up must come down." This familiar saying is an example of life's fundamental rhythm. We see this rhythm in breathing, in waking and sleeping, in the alternation of the seasons, of work and rest.

The gospel reading shows both the Lord Jesus and the apostles working very hard. They were extremely busy. People in great numbers were coming to Jesus, and that he and his apostles did not even have the time to eat. Seeing that it was time to get away from the people, Jesus said to his apostles, "Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest awhile." His apostles are not robots. They have to rest and thus be invigorated.

We all need some time to rest. This is a legitimate human need. Jesus knows that no one can be continually productive without moments of separation from daily work, and moments to gather up energy and rebuild one's strength. Priests are probably among the worst offenders when it comes to balancing work and rest. Often, priests try to give the impression of being superhuman. They do not want to say "no" to any request, because to say "no" is to send out a wrong signal. What is the result? Often they end up as burn-out cases with nothing to offer their flock.

Indeed we need to take time off to nourish our bodies. That is why during summer, people go on vacation. Vacations are important moments to recreate our energies by relaxing, bonding activities, and enjoyment. Unfortunately, there are continue next page

Fernando Velazquez Maria San Pedro Parish Trustees those who take vacations but return more physically exhausted and stressed due to lack of sleep and fatigue. This is not the rest that Jesus is talking about.

The word "rest" is an important word in the Bible. In the book of Genesis, for example, we read that after God created the universe, he rested. "God . . . rested on the seventh day from all the work he had undertaken. So God blessed the seventh day and made it holy . . . . "(Genesis 2:2-3). In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus said to the people, "Come to me all you who labor and overburdened and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28).

In other words, to rest is not simply to be away from a stressful job. It is resting with the Lord. It means pulling ourselves away from the normal cares and worries of the world in order to put ourselves in touch with God. St. Augustine stated this point clearly when he said in words that have become classical, "Our hearts were made for you, O God, and they are restless until they rest in you."

We all need to get away, to be by ourselves, to have our time of rest. For in life, the danger from constant action is very real - it prevents reflection and often pushes us towards wrong priorities. This need for rest is the reason for God's third commandment: "Remember to keep holy the Lord's day."

That is precisely the meaning of our Sunday celebration. For us Christians, Sunday, the first day of the week, is the Day of the Lord. What the Sabbath is to the Jews, Sunday is for us Christians. But while the Jews strictly enforce the no-work discipline on Sabbath, Christians do not. If it is really necessary, we can at times do some work on Sunday, but with the clear understanding that it is the Day of the Lord. We are asked to take some rest on Sunday and avoid work so that we can have time to go to Mass and have the opportunity to focus our time and attention on the Lord, to be with him and to be energized and inspired by his grace.

There are seven days a week. God gives six days to us to use for ourselves. Let us, therefore, faithfully observe the obligation to keep holy the Lord's Day - Sunday. The best way to do it is through the celebration of the Eucharist. Our presence at Sunday Mass does not only give us the necessary break from the pressures of our daily work but it also gives us the opportunity to be guided and inspired by the word of the Lord and to be strengthened and nourished by his Body and Blood. Moreover, it is also an opportunity for us to praise and thank the Lord, from whose generous hands every good gift comes.

We must learn to pause and relax and spend time with the Lord who renews fatigued muscles, tired minds, and sapped spirits. Rest in the Lord!



#### Saint's Corner:

#### St. Bridget July 23

Bridget was born in 1303 in Sweden. Her father was the governor of the province of Upland. At the age of 14 she was married to a young prince, and the marriage lasted happily for 28 years. They had eight children, four boys and four girls. One of the girls, Catherine, became a saint - St. Catherine of Sweden.

From an early age, Bridget had visions of the Crucified Lord. At ten years old, she had a vision of Jesus hanging upon the cross saying to her, "Look upon me, my daughter." Bridget said, "Who has treated you thus?" She seemed to hear a voice saying, "They who despise, and spurn my love for them." That vision was never effaced from her mind, and from that time the sufferings of Christ became the center of her spiritual life.

After the death of her husband, Bridget dedicated herself to a life of prayer as her visions intensified. She was inspired to found a monastery for men and women. This group eventually became a new religious Order. This new congregation was officially approved in 1370 by Pope Urban V. The new congregation became to be called the Order of the Holy Savior, presently known as the Bridgettines.

Constantly accompanied by her daughter, Catherine, who became a saint, Bridget exercised a wide apostolate among the rich and the poor, sheltering the homeless, and giving messages of warning in times that were full of unrest and corruption. Among other causes she embraced, she worked untiringly for the return of the pope who was residing in Avignon (France) to Rome. In many other ways, too, she devoted herself to urging reforms within the Church. Thus she denounced abuses of bishops and abbots and advised princes and kings on political mat-

Bridget died in 1373, and was canonized barely 18 years after her death, in 1391, by Pope Boniface IX. She is the patron saint of Sweden. Bridget's life shows that one can be deeply immersed in God and yet be also completely involved in many contemporary issues. For there is no contradiction between genuine life of prayer and secular activity. One can lead a holy life in the marketplace.
