From the Pastor's Desk 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time October 13, 2024 Mark 10:17-30

Dear Ascension Family,

Blessings of peace and good health!

Do you want to go to heaven? Most, if not all, of us will say, "Yes, of course!" In the gospel reading today, a young man approached Jesus, knelt before him and asked, "Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" He, too, wanted to go to heaven.

What reply did Jesus give? Jesus gave him the standard answer: observe the commandments. The young man responded, "All of these I have observed from my youth." His response indicated that he was not satisfied with it, that he was looking for something more.

Then Jesus made another proposal. "You are lacking in one thing. Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come, follow me." We could imagine the young man saying in shocked disbelief, "You must be kidding!" No wonder that the young man's "face fell, and went away sad, for he had many possessions."

The enormity of the challenge was expressed in Jesus' words: "How hard it is for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God!." The disciples were equally as shocked at Jesus' words. What made it more shocking was the strong Jewish belief that wealth was a sign of God's blessing.

Jesus did not tell the young man to sell all he had because riches were evil. Riches are not bad. Being creatures of God riches are good, like the rest of creation. But riches exert a very strong and seductive attraction so that we are drawn to them and away from their source, who is God. Riches become a rival god, Mammon, seducing us to seek riches at the expense of our relationship with God.

In our own experience, we see many instances of what the pursuit of wealth and one's attitude towards it can do to a person. Such a person works for practically 24 hours a continue next page

Some even steal and kill just to have more and more money. Moreover, the pursuit of wealth makes people hard and selfish. Because their only concern is themselves, they become unmindful of those with less in life.

A wealthy man went to a wise man and asked, "Why is it that riches would make a person unhappy when it is supposed to bring happiness?" "Come to the window," said the wise man, "and tell me what you see through the glass." "I see people on the streets," replied the wealthy man. "Fine, now come and look through this other glass," the wise man told him. It was a large mirror. "Tell me, what do you see now?" "I just see myself," said the wealthy man. "Just yourself? That is the difference when the glass is coated with silver. The possession of riches affects our point of view and gives a selfish coloring to our way of thinking."

That is why we should keep our heart in the right place. We should seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and love God in all things and above all things. Then riches will not be our master but our slave, which we shall freely dispose of according to the will of God.

Unfortunately, this did not seem to be the case with the rich young man in the gospel reading. When challenged by Jesus to sell his possessions and to give to the poor, and then follow him, he went away sad.

Bur there are others who were able to detach themselves from their possessions. And often these are not only rich people, but even poor people, who in spite of their needs find it in their heart to share what little they have with others. Mother Saint Teresa of Calcutta told a store how she went to a very poor woman and gave her some rice. Right away the woman divided it into two and started to go somewhere. Mother Saint Teresa asked where she was going, and she answered, "I am going to my neighbor and share what you have given me; she is in even greater need than I."

Jesus invites us, as he invited the rich young man in today's gospel reading, to trust in God and him alone. He wants us to see that true discipleship goes beyond keeping a set of rules. The demands of Jesus on us are impossible if we are left to ourselves. But for God all things are possible.



Saint's Corner:

St. Teresa of Avila October 15

Born in 1515 in Avila, Spain, Teresa proved to be one of the great mystics, doctors and women of the Church. She became a member of the Carmelite order at the age of 20, at a time when the Carmelites were losing the spirit of penance and prayer. In fact the Convent of the Incarnation which she entered was very big with about 150 sisters and it was more like a sorority house than a convent. As a consequence of this, the first 20 years of Teresa's religious life were a period of mediocrity. Fortunately, after an uncle of hers gave her a book on mental prayer, she began to practice this kind of prayer. After a period of intense inner struggle, she began to experience what she later described as the "prayer of quiet" and the "prayer of union" - meditation and contemplation. At about the age of 40, Teresa experienced a deep interior conversion and realized that religious life and Catholic life generally had to be deeper than outward gestures and observances.

Teresa led an intense religious life and initiated a reform of the Carmelite order. A storm of hostility and persecution from her fellow Carmelites greeted her move, but Teresa remained firm and calm through it all, trusting in God alone. Eventually, she was allowed to start her own branch of the Carmelites called the "Discalced Carmelites" or Carmelites 'without shoes" to indicate their simple austerity. She was able to found 16 other reformed convents for women before her death. With the help of St. John of the Cross, she founded two reformed monasteries for men. Her reform of the Carmelites helped not only the Order but also made the life of the Church spiritually healthier.

Teresa wrote spiritual works which served as a "road map" of the spiritual life. Her most famous work is called the *Interior Castle* in which she pictures a person going in their spiritual life from room to room, each with its own furniture and obstacles, finally coming to the Throne Room of the King which is deep union with God. We can arrive at that Throne Room only by going through the other rooms first. There is no secret elevator to a mature spiritual life. Spiritual growth is real but gradual.


Teresa's health was poor most of her life. Yet, despite her frail constitution, she accomplished astonishing things. She died during a visiting tour of her convents in 1582. She was canonized by Pope Gregory XV in 1622 and declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope Paul VI in 1970.

Teresa teaches us many things: courage in surmounting difficulties, patience in accepting persecution and illness, and many other things. But perhaps her greatest lesson for us is about mental prayer or meditation. She showed that personal prayer is a decisive factor in one's spiritual life. We cannot hope to become saints without maintaining a generous amount of personal prayer in our lives. How much exactly depends on each one's particular state of life, obligations, health, motions of the Holy Spirit. But prayer there must be. It is our spiritual oxygen and, in the long run, a source of great comfort, peace and joy.




