to be served, 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time October 20, 2024
Mark 10:35-45

Dear Ascension Family,

Blessings of peace and good health!

The apostles were remarkably slow to grasp the significance of Jesus' life and teaching. The gospel reading today is a good example. The two brothers, James and John, asked Jesus whether they would be allowed to rule with him and sit one at his right and the other at his left in his kingdom. Being on the left and the right implies immediate access to power. A person who is on the left or the right can whisper into the ear of the powerful.

James and John, in their request to Jesus, were trying to get a step ahead of the other apostles. They were very ambitious. They wanted the top places in Jesus' kingdom. Clearly, the brothers James and John imbibed the spirit of the world. Their understanding of greatness reflects that of the understanding of the world. In the kingdom of the world, the standard of greatness was honor and power or domination. Jesus was very much aware of this. That is why he said, "You know that those who are recognized as rulers over the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones make their authority over them felt." In this world, the powerful often make their authority felt by exploiting the weak and the powerless.

In response to the request of James and John, Jesus said: "You do not know what you are asking." It was not so much a reproach as a hint that he was disappointed by their lack of understanding. Jesus' teaching so far should have revealed the conditions that must be fulfilled in order to gain access to the kingdom, but the two brothers did not seem to have gotten the message yet.

At once Jesus challenged them with the question: "Can you drink the cup that I drink or be baptized with which I am baptized?" The two brothers replied: "We can." Clearly they had still not understood what lay ahead for Jesus, their Master. The "cup" Jesus referred to would be a cup of bitter suffering. His "baptism" would not be in water continue next page

Fernando Velazquez Maria San Pedro Parish Trustees but in blood. If the two brothers had really understood that, they might not have been so eager to make the request.

When the other ten apostles heard what the two brothers asked, they reacted with indignation because they would have asked the same request themselves. Anger and jealousy got the better of them. Then Jesus called them all together. Since they were worrying about precedence and personal position, Jesus tried to explain the logic of the kingdom to them. Its logic is completely different from that which prevails in human society.

Jesus made quite clear the different standards of greatness in his kingdom of the world. In the kingdom of Jesus the standard of greatness was that of service. Jesus said: "Whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be slave of all." For Jesus, greatness was never about honor and power. It was always about service. Greatness begins with a servant mentality. Servants put the needs of others first; they expect to receive orders; they expect to sacrifice themselves for the sake of others; they put themselves at the disposal of those who would benefit from their service; they expect to give than to receive. In other words, if James and John wanted to be great, sitting at Jesus' right and left in his kingdom, they must be the servant of all.

Scripture scholar William Barclay said: "Greatness consisted not in reducing others to one's service, but in reducing oneself to their service. The test was not what service can I extract, but, what service can I give. . . The basic trouble is that it is human nature to want to do as little as possible and to get as much as possible" (The Gospel of Mark: The New Daily Study Bible, pp.298-299).

That greatness consisted in service was not just a teaching which Jesus offered to his disciples. He himself exemplified it in his own life. Jesus who was God became man, took the condition of a slave and became obedient, even to death on the cross, for our salvation.

This Sunday, we celebrate World Mission Sunday. Let our thoughts turn toward the missions and missionaries. Let us include in our prayers the missionaries all over the world who are laboring to spread the Christian faith in different parts of the world. Let us also support them with whatever financial help we can contribute. They have offered their lives for the sake of Christ. They are truly great men and women because they are following Jesus, the Son of God, who "did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many."

Let us thank the Lord for opening wide for us the road that leads to true greatness.

#### Saint's Corner:

# St. John of Capistrano

October 23

John was born at Capistrano, Italy, in the year 1386. He was born at a time when there was an atmosphere of gloom and doom. The Black Death or bubonic plague had decimated the population of Europe. Another source of gloom and doom was the state of the Church. From 1378 to 1417 the Church suffered the Western Schism, during which time there were two or even three popes. Moreover, the city-states of Italy were constantly in conflict. Naturally, the economic situation in Italy during those years of pandemic and political turmoil was terrible - another reason for pessimism. But John proved to be unaffected by the prevailing pessimism of the times. He just went ahead, like an irresistible force of nature, and profoundly influenced for good the people of his generation.

John had a brilliant mind, became a lawyer and then judge, and at age 26 was made governor of the city of Perugia. During a war against a rival city, he was taken prisoner and this period of forced inactivity brought him to reexamine his life as a worldly man. He decided to change his lifestyle. As soon as he regained his freedom in October 1415, he entered, at age 30, the Franciscan novitiate and was ordained a priest four years later. John became one of the most powerful preachers of his generation. He became an itinerant preacher. He preached not only throughout Italy, but at the request of the pope he also preached in France, Germany, Austria and Poland. Everybody wanted to hear him, for he already had the reputation of a living saint. He lived a life of austerity, wore a hair-shirt continually, slept only three or four hours, and devoted long hours to prayer. His preaching attracted great crowds at a time of religious apathy, and was instrumental in reviving a dying faith. He was a man aflame for Christ and the Church.

In 1455, Pope Calistus II commissioned John to go to Hungary and organize a defensive Crusade against the invading Muslim Turks who were advancing to lay siege to Belgrade in the hope of conquering Europe. With great difficulty John succeeded in raising an army which gained victory in the great battle of Belgrade, thus saving Europe for Christianity. Unfortunately, shortly thereafter John died on October 23, 1456.

John of Capistrano was a mover and a doer. His deep Christian optimism inspired him throughout his life and gave him the energy, though he was small and frail, to tackle big issues with the confidence generated by his faith in Christ. That faith of John is also ours. With the strength that Christ gives to his followers, we too should not be afraid to tackle problems at all levels. With God, no problem is too big or impossible to solve. Because, as the Bible tells us, "all things are possible with God."
