From the Pastor's Desk

31st Sunday in Ordinary Time
November 3, 2024
Mark 12:28b-34

Dear Ascension Family,

Blessings of peace and good health!

A story is told about St. John the Evangelist who was said to have spent his last years as an old man in the island of Patmos. He was asked, "Why do you keep writing and talking about love?" His answer was, "Is there anything else more important?" Indeed, where there is love, there is God, for God is love.

At the heart of the Jewish religion were the Ten Commandments given by God to Moses. From these the rabbis had developed a list of 613 separate laws: 248 commands and 365 prohibitions. Obviously no one could possibly remember all those laws in daily life. Hence the rabbis vied with each other to formulate a "greatest" or most important law that would sum up everything God commanded.

One of the most famous of these attempts was that of the Rabbi Hillel, a contemporary of Jesus, who undertook to summarize the whole law while standing on one foot. "What you yourself hate, don't do to your neighbor," Rabbi Hillel said. "That is the whole of God's law. Everything else is commentary."

When Jesus was asked in today's gospel reading about which is the first among all the commandments, he was being asked to give his opinion on a matter that occupied debates among Jewish rabbis. It was not merely an academic exercise. It was a practical matter for an observant Jew. With the 613 commandments to observe, it makes sense to identify which among all these is the most important and covers all the other commandments.

Jesus' answer was not new. He quoted from the Old Testament. The first is this: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength" (Dt 6:5). The second is this: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Lv 19:18). Jesus puts the two commandments together and makes

them one. For Jesus, love of God and love of neighbor go hand in hand; they cannot be separated, like two sides of the same coin. The apostle John stresses this point in his First Letter. He says: *“If someone says he loves God, but hates his brother, he is a liar; for whoever does not love a brother whom he has seen cannot love God whom he has not seen”* (1John 4:20). True love of neighbor springs from true love of God. On the other hand, there can be no true love of God which does not express itself in love of neighbor.

Moreover, Jesus reminds the Jews that “neighbor” is not just his fellow Jews. Neighbor is not defined by race or religion. A neighbor is a person in need. That is the point of the Parable of the Good Samaritan. The man who fell among robbers needed help. The Samaritan was moved with compassion at the sight of the victim, presumed to be a Jew. And we should recall how much the Jews and Samaritans hated each other. But for the Samaritan in the parable, the fact that the victim was a Jew was beside the point. A human being was in need, and he responded to that need.

In the 12th century, there lived in Spain a famous Jewish teacher named Maimonides. Basing himself on the gospel reading today, he outlined eight degrees or steps in what he called the ladder of charity. They are interestingly thought provoking and informative. I will just mention the seventh, which says: “The finest act of charity is to bestow it in such a way that the benefactor does not know the recipient, or the recipient the benefactor.” In other words, true charity delights in doing good secretly and anonymously, and with no thoughts of recompense or gratitude.

I am reminded of a story about a man who was very generous to an orphanage. He did not reveal his name or status. The superior of the orphanage requested for his identity, but the man just said, “Sister, that is not important.” But the Sister kept insisting, “Please, tell us who you are.” “There is no need, Sister,” the man said. “Please, tell us at least your name,” the Sister said. “Okay, Sister,” the man said, “I will tell you my name, if you can tell me the name of the Good Samaritan.” The Sister thought for a while, and then had to honestly confess. “I’m sorry. I don’t know the name of the Good Samaritan.” “Neither do I, Sister,” added the generous man, “so just let us keep it that way. If I were to tell you my name, you would feel indebted to me, and that would spoil it.”

Jesus knew that a lot of unhappiness and human sufferings is caused by the absence or lack of love. Thus the commandment of love - for God and for neighbor. But we have to love as Jesus has loved us - without counting the cost and without thinking of rewards.

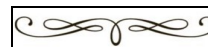

Saint's Corner:

St. Charles Borromeo
November 4

Charles was born of a wealthy family in northern Italy in 1538. At the age of 21 he graduated from the University of Pavia with a doctorate in civil and cannon law. Soon afterwards he was called to Rome by Pope Pius IV, made him Secretary of State and piled up on him many administrative responsibilities. Charles worked hard to bring about the reassembling of the Council of Trent, which had been suspended ten years earlier. In 1562 despite great difficulties the Council was convened for its third and last session. In 1563 the Council came to a successful closure and many of the most important dogmatic and disciplinary decrees of Church reform were passed. After that Charles was asked by the pope to supervise the composition of the new catechism which contained the teachings of the Council of Trent. Finally, he was ordained a priest in 1563 and two months later ordained bishop and named archbishop of Milan.

The archdiocese of Milan was an immense territory covering 15 dioceses. It had been without a resident bishop for 80 years and was in a deplorable state with priests devoid of zeal. Upon taking possession, Charles immediately held provincial councils and diocesan synods with the purpose of reforming the archdiocese by enacting the reforming decrees of the Council of Trent. For the next 19 years Charles would prove the ideal shepherd, taking care of his people, correcting abuses, establishing seminaries, founding hospitals, replacing unworthy priests. He himself set the example by living a life of prayer and austerity. Naturally he met a lot of opposition in his work of reform. At least twice his enemies tried to assassinate him.

In 1576 one of the most horrible plagues of the century broke out in Milan. Charles showed heroic self-sacrifice in the way he tried to help the sick. Exhausted by all his incredible efforts, Charles Borromeo died in 1584 at the age of 46. He was canonized in 1610 by Pope Paul V.

Charles Borromeo had everything going for him: a prestigious family, excellent education, power and money. He chose to ignore all that and instead serve the Church. He gave his life to make the Church better, and he made it better first by leading a holy life himself and then by encouraging others to live a holy life.
