From the Pastor's Desk

Second Sunday of Lent
March 1, 2026
Matthew 17:1-9

Dear Ascension Family,

As we journey together through this sacred season of Lent, let us come together as a parish community for a special Lent Reflection on **March 18, 2026, at 7:00PM** in the church. We are honored to welcome Rev. Fr. Jonah Teller, a member of the Order of Preachers (Dominican Order), who will guide us in deepening our relationship with the Lord and preparing our hearts for the celebration of Easter.

This is a wonderful opportunity to set aside the distractions of daily life and enter into a more profound and grace-filled Lenten journey. Come and experience the Word of God in the Dominican way.

I would like to inform you that I will be away from March 1 to 9 as I travel on pilgrimage to Assisi with some of our parishioners for the special occasion of the opening of the tomb of St. Francis of Assisi for the first time after 800 years.

I will be remembering our entire parish community in a special way at the tomb of St. Francis, asking for his intercession for our families, our parish, and all our intentions. I ask for your prayers for a safe journey and fruitful pilgrimage.

We are in the 2nd Sunday of Lent. The gospel reading is about the amazing, unimaginable, and mysterious event of the transfiguration of Jesus.

On a mountain Jesus was transfigured, his face shining bright as the sun and his clothes becoming white as light. Then the two greatest heroes of the Jewish people who have been dead for centuries - Moses, the greatest lawgiver, and Elijah, the greatest prophet - were in conversation with Jesus. Peter was so fascinated by this wonderful experience that he wanted to prolong it that he proposed to Jesus to build three tents - one each for Jesus, Moses and Elijah. Then a voice from the cloud was heard saying, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased. Listen to him."

What does the transfiguration mean for the apostles then and for us today?

There is a mysterious story in the Second Book of Kings. Israel is at war with Aram, and the prophet Elisha is using his prophetic powers to reveal the strategic plan of the Aramean army to the Israelites. At first the king of Aram thinks that one of his military officers is playing the spy, but when he learns the truth he sent troops to capture Elisha who is residing in Dotham. The Aramean troops move in under cover of darkness and surround the city. In the morning Elisha's servant discovers that they are surrounded and fears for his master's safety. He said to Elisha, "Oh, my lord, what shall we do?" The prophet answered, "Don't be afraid. Those who are with us are more than those who are with them." But who would believe what Elisha said when the surrounding mountainside is covered with advancing enemy troops? So Elisha prays, "O Lord, open his eyes so he may see." Then the Lord opened the eyes of the servant, and he saw the hills full of horses and chariots of fire surrounding Elisha (see 2 Kings 6:8-23). This vision was all that the servant of Elisha needed to reassure him. At the end of the story, not only was Elisha safe but the invading army was totally humiliated.

This story can help us understand the significance of Jesus' transfiguration for all his disciples. Let us look at the context of Jesus' transfiguration.

Prior to the transfiguration event, Peter has confessed that Jesus was the Messiah, and Jesus accepted this profession of faith as true. But then Jesus started to speak of his suffering and death, which was to be followed by his rising again. Peter could not take this and said, "God forbid, Lord. No such thing shall ever happen to you." This earned Peter the reproach of Jesus who said to him, "Get behind me, Satan!" It is not difficult to imagine how downhearted the apostles would have become upon hearing from Jesus about his suffering and death, and on top of that the challenge that they must deny themselves and carry their cross. In other words, like the servant of Elisha, the apostles needed to see the glory of Jesus to strengthen their faith so that when Christ dies on the cross, they will be able to look beyond his death to the glory of the resurrection.

The transfiguration does the same for us. It gives us a glimpse of the glory that lies ahead of us, a glimpse so powerful that it can keep us going when we want to quit, call up extra strength when we think that we have none left, and renew our hopes when everything seems hopeless. When disappointments, pains and sufferings come our way, as they have and will, we can bear them in a spirit of faith, with our own transfiguration in mind.

No cross, no glory - let this be a constant subject of our reflection during the season of Lent. There is no promise of cheap grace. The eternal happiness to which we are called requires a willingness to suffer and die in Christ so as to rise with him. Amen.

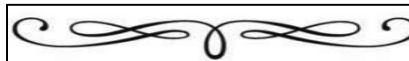

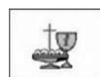

Saint's Corner:

St. Peter Damian
February 21

Peter Damian was born in Ravenna, Italy, in 1007. His brother, who was archpriest of Ravenna, sent him for a first class education. He became a teacher.

Already as a student, he demonstrated a deep piety. He wore a hair shirt under his clothes to mortify his flesh and keep his sexual urges under control, spent many hours in prayer, and fasted rigorously.

Later on, after a few years spent in the teaching profession, at the age of 28 he became a Benedictine monk. Eight years later, Peter Damian was unanimously chosen by the other monks to become their abbot.

Peter Damian lived at a time that some historians have called the darkest age for the Church. This is how John Fink describes that Church in his book on the Doctors of the Church: "The State, whether Italy or Germany, controlled Church affairs. This control began with Charlemagne in the ninth century and reverted to powerful Roman families in the tenth century. Church officials could not even elect the pope. Until 962 one or another Roman family chose the pope, usually a member of that family. The popes were secular men, usually more intent on furthering their families' finances than caring for the Church. The clerical vocation became a quick route to wealth and power. Clerical marriage and concubinage were prevalent and in some places the episcopacy itself became a hereditary position filled by a bishop's son. Religious practices among the clergy declined as corruption among the clergy grew. Preaching was largely discontinued and sacraments were neglected."

Peter Damian began to work at the reform of the Church at large. This he did primarily by writing extensively against the many vices prominent among the clergy and encouraged the popes in their efforts at reforming the Church. When he was made cardinal-bishop of Ostia, Peter Damian worked hard to reform his clergy.

Peter Damian reminds us that true reform of the Church begins with oneself. Before working at the reform of the Church, Peter Damian started off by reforming himself, making sure he himself was trying his best to be faithful to Christ - and kept at it throughout his life.
