From the Pastor's Desk

12th Sunday in Ordinary Time
June 21, 2026
Matthew 10:26-33

Dear Ascension Family,

Blessings of peace and good health! First of all, we would like to congratulate the children in our Religious Education Program for the year 2025-2026 who made their First Holy Communion last June 13, 2026. May God bless them abundantly. Our gratitude goes to their parents. Their commitment to nurturing their children's faith at home and ensuring they attended their religious education classes is a beautiful testament to their love for them. We are also deeply grateful to our religious education team - Sr. Genevieve, the catechists and volunteers, for their dedication and patience in preparing the children to receive the Eucharist for the first time.

Receiving the Eucharist is not just a personal blessing, but a spiritual fuel meant to empower us to live out our faith boldly in the world, which is the challenge of the gospel reading today.

I am reminded of a story entitled *Tom Brown's School Days*. It is about an English Boy's School. A new boy had come to the school. As he got ready for bed the first night, he knelt down to say his prayers in a dormitory with twelve other lads. Tom Brown was among them. He turned just in time to see a heavy shoo sailing through the air in the direction of the kneeling boy's head. Laughter and ridicule followed. For some time Tom could not sleep. He kept thinking of his mother and the prayers she had taught him, prayers he had not said since coming to the school. The following night he also knelt down to pray. The other boys were looking forward to making fun of the newcomer again, but when they saw their idol, Tom Brown, on his knees beside his bed, there was respectful silence. The courage of the newcomer and the courage of Tom Brown won for them the respect and admiration of the entire school.

Fear haunts everyone. We all have a whole variety of legitimate fears. That is why three times in the course of the gospel reading today, Jesus calls on his disciples not to be afraid. He is not talking about fear in general. He is speaking about that particular kind of fear a Christian feels when he is called upon to say something or do something that shows he is a follower of Christ. Jesus wanted his disciples to proclaim his message in the same manner as he did - without fear. *"What I say to you in the darkness, speaking in the light; what you hear whispered, proclaim on the housetops."* Jesus knew that in witnessing to and proclaiming his message, the disciples would face opposition, persecution and even death. But they were not to fear because God cares for them. To explain himself, Jesus used the image of the sparrows. The sparrows are valueless creatures that they are continue next page

ground for "next to nothing." Yet each of them is under the watchful eye of the heavenly Father. "Not one of them falls to the ground without your Father's knowledge...you are worth more than many sparrows." Thus the disciples should not be afraid of what people would say or do to them as they carry out their mission.

In the twentieth century alone there are many examples of those who were not afraid to say something or do something that shows they are a follower of Christ. In 1902 a young girl in Italy by the name of Maria Goretti refused to be intimidated by a man who threatened to kill her because she refused his sexual advances. He killed her. Maria Goretti was declared a saint by Pope Pius XII in 1950. Her mother and Alexander Serenelli, the man who killed her, were present at her canonization. During the Second World War Maximilian Kolbe, a Polish priest who refused to be intimidated by the Nazis, bravely fought against Nazism and finally offered his life in exchange for a prisoner, a husband and father, whom the commandant of the concentration camp had singled out for execution. Maximilian Kolbe was declared a saint on October 10, 1982.

These days we are in danger of being intimidated by anti-Catholic groups in our society. Pro-choice advocates would make us feel that we violate women's rights when we insist that abortion is an unspeakable crime. Like Tom Brown we could be afraid to say our prayers in public square, to speak for our Catholic belief when it is mocked or ridiculed by people like the Sisters of Perpetual Indulgence.

Everyday we are confronted with situations and pressures to abandon our Catholic beliefs. Fear paralyzes us not to witness to Christ, to our Catholic faith because we are afraid of the smirks and sneers of others, we are afraid of losing our worldly securities. How different St. Maximilian Kolbe and St. Maria Goretti, and countless other men and women like them throughout history. They believed with conviction the words of Jesus in today's gospel reading: "Everyone who acknowledges me before others I will acknowledge before my heavenly Father."

May we have the courage to bear witness to Christ at all times . God bless us all.

Saint's Corner:

St. Anthony of Padua

June 13

It is a long-standing tradition in the Church that, when we lose something, we pray to St. Anthony of Padua and he will help us find what we lost. Experience probably tells us that such a prayer often produces the desired result. Why exactly is St. Anthony supposed to be the finder of lost articles? We do not really know. The only story about Anthony which could have connection with this strange expertise of his is contained in the *Chronicles of the Twenty-Four Generals of the Franciscan order*. There it says that one day a novice ran away with a valuable book, a collection of the Psalms, which Anthony had been using. Anthony prayed for its recovery and the novice was so frightened by a sudden apparition that he brought the book back.

Whether that story is true or not, we will probably never know. Fortunately, though, there are a lot of other facts we know about Anthony which are even more remarkable. We know, for example, that he lived only 36 years but that he packed those 36 years with great many achievements, while becoming a saint as well. In fact, he was so universally recognized as a saint when he died that Pope Gregory IX canonized him only 11 months later. No saint before or after him was canonized so quickly.

Anthony received a good early education and at the age of 15 joined the Augustinians. Later when the bodies of the first Franciscan martyrs were brought from Morocco to Portugal, he was filled with intense longing to be a martyr. To realize his desire, he transferred to the Franciscan Order. Right after that he was sent on mission to Morocco to preach the Gospel to the Moors. But soon a serious illness forced him to return to Europe. The ship that carried him back to Portugal was driven off its course by a storm and landed in Sicily. From there Anthony made his way to Assisi, where his Order was holding a general chapter at which St. Francis of Assisi himself was present.

In Assisi, Anthony's superiors discovered by accident his extraordinary eloquence as a preacher and his great knowledge of Scripture. So they sent him to preach throughout northern Italy and southern France. Anthony became famous almost overnight and successful in his preaching tours. Crowds flocked to hear him. When congregations overflowed the churches, Anthony preached in the public squares. Moreover, Anthony was given the assignment of professor of theology to his own Franciscan brothers, the first person to fill such position. He also taught theology in the universities of Bologna, Montepellier and Toulouse. Aside from preaching and teaching, he was also appointed local and then provincial superior in the Franciscan Order. However, he then obtained from the Pope the permission to be excused from holding any other offices so as to devote all his time and energy to preaching, the apostolate for which he was so eminently qualified. So Anthony moved to Padua and henceforth concentrated on preaching.

Anthony gave so much of himself in all his preaching that his health finally broke down. After having preached a course of sermons during Lent of 1231, Anthony dies of exhaustion on June 13 of that year at the age of only 36.
