### *From the Pastor's Desk*

13th Sunday in Ordinary Time  
June 28, 2026  
Matthew 10:37-42

Dear Ascension Family,

Blessing of peace! I hope you are well and healthy. This Sunday we hear about the demands made on anyone who wants to follow Jesus. The demands are worth pondering as they prompt us to reassess and discern our way of life as disciples of Christ.

The family is a beautiful institution, one of the pearls of God's creation. And so, the love of one's family is certainly a good and beautiful thing. In fact, God made it one of the 10 commandments when he said, "Honor your father and your mother."

However, love for one's family, like anything human, can be an obstacle in faithfully following Christ. Jesus says: "Whoever loves father or mother ... son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me." What would I choose? Would I favor my family, or would I choose to be faithful to Christ? To follow Jesus does not mean that we should abandon our natural love for our parents and children. What Christ demands is that if and when it becomes a selection between Him and our closest relatives, we should not make a compromise: it should be Him and no body else.

The call to follow Jesus is never easy. It is a call to take the way of the cross. In the gospel reading today Jesus tells his disciples: "Whoever does not take up his cross and follow after me is not worthy of me." Many of us follow Jesus up to the cross, but not onto the cross. We follow Jesus up to a point but we back off when we have to carry our cross, when to be with Jesus is risky, or painful. When some tragedy or hardship strikes us, we are tempted not to pick up the cross and follow Jesus. We are tempted to turn away from Jesus and not longer follow his footsteps.

A story is told that the Lord summoned two of his disciples and gave each one a cross of the same weight. He asked them to carry it up to the end of the road, where he would wait for them. The first disciple carried the cross with ease, while the other disciple lagged behind, obviously having a hard time. After reaching the end of the road, the first disciple handed the cross to his Master. "Well done, my son," the Lord told him and tapped him on his back. Then the other disciple reached the end of the road very much behind the first. When he got there, he threw the cross at the Lord's feet. "It is not fair!" He complained. "You gave me a heavier cross than the first disciple, that is why it took me longer to get here!"

"Son," the Lord said, "both the crosses are of the same weight." "But how come I carried mine with much difficulty while he carried his with ease?" The Lord replied, "The problem was not the cross but your attitude. Your every complaint only added to the weight of the cross. The first disciple carried his cross with ease because every loving thought of Me diminished its weight."

Moreover, in the gospel reading Jesus says that anyone who loses his life for his sake will find it. Jesus states the paradox that we find life by giving ourselves away. The manner in which we give ourselves away may not be noticed by others. But Jesus declares that if anyone gives so much as a cup of cold water to one of the little ones, they will most certainly not lose their reward. Giving a cup of cold water to someone who needs it is not going to make headlines. Most likely, only the giver and the receiver will be aware of it. Yet, Jesus holds up this small act as having eternal consequences. The giving of a cup of cold water can stand for any number of small acts of kindness which give life to others in some way.

Jesus is trying to teach us the value of what we might be inclined to dismiss as of very little significance. In all sorts of ways throughout our parish, people are giving the equivalent of a cup of cold water to those who need it. Parents are doing it for their children every day of the week, especially in those times when children fall ill. Neighbors are doing as much for each other. Parishioners sharing their time and talent serving the parish in various ways. Few of us are given the chance to perform great deeds. But the chance to give a cup of cold water can come our way several times in the course of the day.

Jesus indicates that in the giving of the cup of cold water, there is more going on than we might realize. He states: "Whoever receives you receives me, and whoever receives me receives the one who sent me." Indeed, the giving of the cup of cold water is more significant than we realize - and so too is the failure to give it.

**Saint's Corner:****St. Aloysius Gonzaga**

June 21

Aloysius was born in 1568 from a princely and aristocratic family. His father, Don Ferrante, was an Italian nobleman, the Marquis of Castiglione. Both his father and mother held positions of honor in the court of King Philip II of Spain. Don Ferrante dreamed that his firstborn son would become a great soldier. Consequently, he would take Aloysius, though he was only four years old, on training expeditions to teach him the art of arms. On these occasions the young boy wore a suit of armor and walked at his father's side reviewing the troops.

However, for some mysterious reason, all of a sudden at about the age of seven, he experienced a spiritual awakening. Then he began to add more vocal prayers to his babyhood prayers, like praying the Psalms, the Office of Our Lady, and other devotions - all recited on bare knees.

In 1577 Don Ferrante took Aloysius and his younger brother Rudolph to Florence to the court of his friend, Grand Duke Francesco de Medici, where the two brothers were to improve their Latin and Italian, and to learn the customs of a princely life. There Aloysius found himself immersed in a society of intrigue, deceit, and lust. Far from feeling attracted to all this, Aloysius felt only repulsion for such a life of sin. From then on, what attracted him was the virtue of chastity, which he began to hold in special esteem. And in order to protect his own chastity, he submitted himself to fasting, discipline, custody of the eyes.

Then in 1579, when he was eleven years old, his father removed him and his brother from Florence. It was in that year that the thought of becoming a priest came to him. As a first step towards this ideal, he began teaching catechism to poor boys. On August 15, 1583 while praying before the image of Our Lady, the thought of becoming a Jesuit came to him. That thought never left him. When Don Ferrante heard of his son's desire, he was furious. In order to change Aloysius' mind, he sent him on a tour of the courts of Italy and engaged him on a number of secular commissions. Nothing changed Aloysius' determination. Finally his father relented and gave a reluctant consent. So in early 1583 Aloysius renounced his inheritance right to the family title, left for Rome and there entered the Jesuit Order. He was 17 years old. After two years he made his religious vows and began the study of theology in which he excelled.

In 1591 an epidemic of plague broke out in Rome. The Jesuits opened a hospital of their own and many of them served in it. Aloysius requested that he be allowed to carry the sick to the hospital, wash and feed them, and prepare them to receive the sacraments. Eventually he caught the disease. He died with the name of Jesus on his lips on the octave day of the feast of Corpus Christi. He was only 23 years old. In 1726 Pope Benedict XIII canonized him and three years later declared him patron of the youth. Pope Pius XI confirmed this title in 1926.

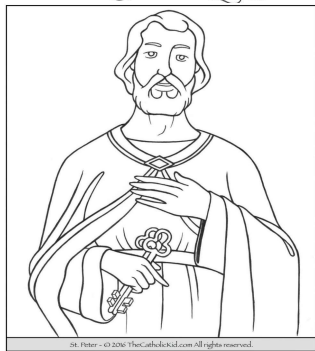
