Seven hundred years before Jesus was born, a Greek slave by the name of Aesop, compiled a collection of stories known today as *Aesop's Fables*. One of the fables deals with a dispute between the sun and the wind over which of the two was the stronger.

One day an opportunity arose to settle the dispute. A man, dressed in a coat, was walking a deserted country road. The sun said to the wind, "Whoever makes that man remove his coat faster will be the winner."

The wind not only agreed, but volunteered to go first. He blew and blew, but the more he blew, the tighter the man held on to his coat. Finally, exhausted, the wind gave up. Then the sun took

over. It merely shone in all its glory. Within minutes, the man took off his coat.

The lesson of the story was this: You can achieve more by gentleness or meekness than by force.

Gentleness does not seem to make much sense in the world today. There is believe that if you want to get on in life, you have to be hard, because if you are gentle, people will walk all over you. Gentleness tend to be equated with weakness.

Gentleness is not a form of weakness. It is a form of strength. As someone said, "Nothing is so strong as gentleness and nothing so gentle as real strength." It takes a strong, self-confident person to be gentle.

A story is told about President Abraham Lincoln, who was considered gentle or meek. On one occasion Abraham Lincoln sent a note by messenger to his Secretary of War, Edwin Stanton. Stanton was a capable man, but was noted for his brusqueness and rigid opinions. As the messenger stood waiting for a reply, Stanton tore up the note and shouted, "President Lincoln is a fool!" When the messenger returned and told the President what the Secretary had said, Lincoln thought a moment, and then said with a grin, "Well, perhaps Mr. Stanton is right!"

Gentleness is one of the most necessary qualities in life. Think of the gentleness required in the hands of a mother of a surgeon. Henri Nouwen, a respected spiritual writer, said: "A gentle person treads lightly, listens carefully, looks tenderly, and touches with reverence." A gentle person knows that healing and growth result from nurturing not forcing.

There was no harshness in Jesus. His approach was very gentle. He didn't force himself on people. He respected their freedom. But he remained faithful to the good work that God sent him to do in spite of the negative response of the people.

A beautiful example of the gentleness or meekness of Jesus was the way he handled the case of the woman caught in adultery (see John 8:1-11). Jesus was gentle not only with the woman, but also with her self-righteous accusers. Jesus did not shout or threaten them. He did not curse or yell. He simply bent over gently, and wrote in the sand with his finger.

It is because we know so little about being gentle with one another, that we have so much trouble in our homes and in the world. "A gentleman is one who thinks of others before himself," said Confucius.

**Saint's Corner:**

**St. Thomas More**  
June 22

St. Thomas More was born in 1477. Many people know about Thomas More from the movie *A Man for All Seasons*. He was an eminent lawyer and a man of deep faith who would go to Mass everyday.

In 1529 Thomas More was made Lord Chancellor of England, a position he filled with great competence and integrity. However, he resigned his post in 1532. He would not support King Henry's divorce from his wife, Catherine of Aragon, in order to marry Anne Boleyn. When King Henry VIII proclaimed himself supreme head of the Church of England, breaking with Rome and denying the Pope as head, Thomas refused to acknowledge it.

In 1535 Thomas More was imprisoned in the Tower of London for refusing to take the oath recognizing the invalidity of King Henry's marriage with Catherine and his supremacy over the Church. When condemned to death, he told his judges he hoped that "we may yet hereafter in Heaven merrily all meet together to everlasting salvation." When about to be beheaded, he declared to the crowd of spectators that he was dying for the Catholic Church and was "the king's good servant - but God's first." Thomas More did not compromise his own moral values in order to please the king, knowing that true allegiance to authority is not blind acceptance of everything that authority wants. His martyrdom was the final and full expression of his ultimate loyalty to Christ and his Church.

Four hundred years later, in 1935, Thomas More was canonized a saint of God. In 2000, Pope St. John Paul II named him patron of political leaders.

Nowadays many Christians are rather confused about issues involving the respective roles of the Church and of the laity in matters of civil law, government policies, elections, and so on. In Thomas More we see a layman giving up his life to affirm the sacredness of marriage and the spiritual authority of the pope over the entire Church. May his prayers and intercessions help us to understand better our own particular role regarding today's political and religious issues.
